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### **A WORD FROM THE PRES**

Community. As I look back on the season just passed, my overwhelming reflection is one of feeling grateful about belonging to the community that is the Portsea Surf Life Saving Club. Communities like ours don't just happen. There is certainly some luck involved, but mostly it is a result of the hard work and passion that our members have given to the Club for almost 75 years. We saw it in spades this season.

Among our 5,300 members there are varying degrees of engagement and involvement in this community - and that's fine. We have some members who are completely immersed: they are at the club almost every weekend, patrolling, delivering education programs, cleaning, lugging gear or helping with the administration of the Club. Some drift in and out, some never leave, some make a ritual of helping at the swims as their annual contribution, and others just want to come down and sit on the deck three or four times a year and feel pleased to be a part of it, knowing that through their membership, they are contributing to the club. Every one of these people contributes.

Our 'Portsea community' stood up big time this year.

Our education team managed to safely execute 'live in' camps in December for the first time in two years. Unbelievable really when you consider what was to follow. Part time Bronze, and live in Bronze and Silver Medallion programs were all a success.

Our nippers, SRC and Cadets all got a start before arguably the biggest wave ever seen at Portsea (Omicron) swept through. Again, our team of volunteers did a superb job to battle through, showing an incredible commitment to deliver these important education programs in a safe, fun environment.

Behind the scenes, our COVID plans were put into action with great support Matt Mahon and understanding from our members, who all played a part in keeping our activities as safe as we could. It was not an easy time.

Our member food and beverage service suffered, as like many, we struggled with available workforce. Those still standing adapted, changed plans, and pleasingly our members understood and supported what service we were able to offer.

As the white water of the wave settled, our events team dusted off COVIDsafe plans developed the year prior and we not only delivered our open water swims we added a run/walk. If the workload wasn't enough, the Pier to Perignon team did it twice, with the initial event date thwarted by a 40-knot northerly.

One constant was our patrols which ran from late November until 25th April, one of the longest seasons on record. Despite the challenges, our patrollers did not miss a beat. Our volunteers recorded a total of 7,682 hours of patrolling on Portsea Back Beach, in which they directly saved 7 lives in major rescues, recorded another 2,818 preventable actions. An amazing 462 members pulled on a red and yellow quartered cap to patrol.

Across the season there were some remarkable highs, and also some lows as our members dealt with various challenges thrown their way. As I look back undoubtedly my key takeout for the season was the extent to which that sense of community was on show. We worked together, we saved lives together, we learned together, we partied together, we grieved together, we laughed together and we supported one another in all that we did.

Thank you to the almost one hundred people that contribute across various committees and working groups, to our paid staff, and to all who have been part of the Portsea community this year. We couldn't do it without you.

I can't wait for next season already. See you on the beach!

### **CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT**

This season has been a rollercoaster of unpredictability and yet another season of tremendous accomplishment. We managed to put a patrol on the beach every single weekend, despite the impact COVID-19 had on our active member base throughout the peak of the season. I would like to thank every single one of our patrolling members for making this possible. In particular, I would like to thank our Patrol Captains, Vice-Captains and our brand-new Lifesaving Director, Sas McNamara. It was amazing to see the way everyone rallied together to keep our beaches safe and support one another under some really trying conditions. Together, we recorded upwards of 6000 patrol hours, performed over 2500 preventative actions and 10 major rescues. This is an incredible feat.

Not only did we manage to excel in the lifesaving arena, but our education team also defied the odds, delivering surf lifesaving education to upwards of 1000 members. Our Nipper Program provided vital surf safety lessons and instilled water confidence in over 600 young members, including 5 Starfish Nippers in the height of the pandemic. I would like to both thank and congratulate the Nipper Subcommittee, led by Brett Croft for providing our youngest beachgoers with the opportunity to enhance their physical and mental wellbeing after 18 months of social isolation and

restrictions on accessing pools and waterways. Similarly, Alex Madden and Andrew Argyrou did an incredible job to introduce Starfish Nippers to Portsea SLSC, which is a program centred around providing lifesaving education to children with disabilities. In addition to our Nipper Program, Jacqui Hart, our Education Director, led the charge to deliver development opportunities to an additional 80 SRCs, 70 Cadets, 90 Bronzies across our live-in and part-time programs and 45 Silver candidates. Thank you to all the instructors, water safety and in particular camp chiefs who made this possible.

Furthermore, not only did we manage to deliver our two major swims this season, but we also introduced a brand-new major event to our club calendar – the Bay to Surf adventure run. The event saw 450 competitors take to the start line at Quarantine station and finish at our very own surf club. This event was a massive success! It was great to see so many smiling faces running and walking along Portsea Back Beach against the backdrop of the picturesque sunset we all know and love. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped with the delivery of the day and in particular, Craig Evans. Craig's unconditional mentoring and support made this event possible.

I'd like to conclude by shedding light on the Operational Committee. These

11 young members are the powerhouse of our club, managing our education programs, patrols, sustainability initiatives, events, competition, first aid, club communications, accommodation and IT systems. Thank you for your tireless efforts this season, I feel so lucky to be supported by such a strong, capable group of people.

I'm so excited for what next season has in store. We're looking forward to introducing a new education program, Portsea Platinum, which is designed to provide our Silver Camp graduates with the opportunity to practice search and rescue operations in a live-in camp setting. If you have any interest in becoming more involved in our club operations or have any ideas and/ or initiatives that you'd like to see implemented, please reach out to me or any member of the Operational Committee. We're committed to continuing to grow and improve our lifesaving community. Have a great offseason, looking forward to seeing you on the beach next season!

Leading into the season, we were ready for the combination of high beach attendance and large surf, however with the rise in COVID-19 cases and many patrollers falling ill, the fate of the Portsea patrolling season was uncertain. Nevertheless, and in very typical Portsea fashion, Portsea SLSC was still able to fill every patrol all season and fulfill our patrolling requirements. Not every club in the state can say the same! I want to say a huge thank you to every active patroller for their flexibility and willingness to help at other patrols when numbers were down.

Portsea was not only able to fulfill our own patrols this season, but we also assisted with fulfilling other clubs on the Peninsula's patrols. One of these clubs was Rosebud LSC. ### YOUTH/OPEN COMPETITION TEAM

The opening event of the season was the Endurance State Champs, where Portsea members took a swag of medals, dominating in the swim events, with golds to Sophie Jacka U14, Logan Brandi U15 Xavier Purcell U17, Mackie Hunter U17, Amanda Benson Masters, plus many minor medals in the swim, ski events and running events, including a trifecta in the U17 2km swim.

December saw a string of carnivals at Ocean Grove, Jan Juc and Mt Martha attended by our core competitors, including the State Team Trials, that saw Xavier Purcell and Gabe Cornwell selected as swimmers for the Victorian State Lifesaving Team that toured to Sydney mid-January. Portsea had 25 youth/open members entered at the January Anglesea carnival, only to see it cancelled by LSV last minute as the organisation was hit by increasing covid cases amongst its staff and senior volunteers.

The Lorne carnival in early February saw a show of strength in the Youth Women's area, with the team of Maggie Betts, Sophie Jacka, Mia Horskins and Annabelle Mahon taking out the U15 Cameron event, Logan Brandi, Xavier Winnett and Charlie Cornwell going 1,2,3 in the U15 tube race plus Gabe Cornwell winning the Open Iron.

For years Portsea's Youth/Open team has shown its strength in the swimming arena. This year unfortunately saw a clash of lifesaving and pool swimming champs both at a state and national level that saw a number of our swimmers need to juggle the two and as such led to diminished numbers at the lifesaving states and Aussies.

Our small team that journeyed to Warrnambool for the Vic Champs were rewarded for their efforts. Charlie Cornwell U15 and Mia Horskins U14 each won gold in their surf races. Bellsy Mahon joined Mia in a composite team to add to the point score in the beach relay, swim team and cameron relay, and Charlie Cornwell joined a composite team to take silver in the U15 cameron relay.

Down in the boat arena Portsea's Open Women's Crew, Amanda Rukuwai, Em von Moger, Scarlett Blewett, Alex Hagan and Stephen Blewett (sweep) was hard rowing! Although missing out on the medals, the crew showed that they have great boat speed when racing head to head with their competitors. The luck of the surf went against the crew who were beaten in two of the heats by teams coming in on waves from behind. Although they won the 4th heat, the team ended up 4th overall.

Without a doubt the stand out competitor at the Vics was Gabe Cornwell who took home a swag of medals including gold in U17 ski and iron, bronze in U17 surf race and then in a massive final effort took bronze in the Open Men's Iron.


### MEMBER ENGAGEMENT REPORT

### PORTSEA SWIM CLASSIC REPORT







January 15, 2022, delivered us a glorious day, and one that once again enabled us to showcase the beautifully pristine waters and other spectacles that the Pt Nepean National Park delivers. This, along with a fast-flowing current, helped all the swimmers enjoy the various races over the 500m, 1500m and 2500m courses.

With the cloud of COVID-19, reinforced by the arrival of Omicron, the spectacle of the Swim Classic once again gave the swimmers the opportunity to have a break from the rigours of the world and to let the enjoyment of the day give their minds some much needed relief. We once again restricted the event numbers to approximately 2500 competitors to maintain the strict safety measure required and to ensure a safe and successful event could be delivered.

This year marked the Portsea Swim Classic's 36th continuous year of the open water swimming event being staged. The ability to achieve this, given the complexities experienced in 2021, and again this year with Omicron, cannot be over emphasized. The lessons that we had learnt, and the systems, processes and understanding that we had developed in 2021 came to the fore. Due to the unwavering dedication from our large group of dedicated volunteers, some of whom had only just recovered from the virus, we were able to effectively deliver the event again.

I can not emphasize the dedication of the area heads of the PSC and those in the greater PSLSC community who worked so hard prior and, on the day, to enable the 2022 PSC to occur. People continue to comment on the professionalism and the way the day operates seamlessly. Unlike many other events that have independent management groups running them, the PSC is planned, and run by PSLSC volunteers, which means

that the PSLSC gains the maximum financial outcome from the day. This is something that we all should not lose sight of and be extremely proud of. The excitement and mental relief that the 2021 PSC was able to deliver, to those competing, had been palpable. To maximize the potential for us to successfully deliver the 2022 PSC, the PSC sub-committee drew on all the lessons that we had learnt from the 2021 event. This process ensured that the necessary contingency planning was in place, and we were able to go into the day with the confidence and tools to deliver the event, in a COVID safe way. The strategies that had seen us successfully stage the 2021 event were once again implemented, but as with 2021, the realisation that the 2022 event may not proceed was always a real possibility.

It was another proud moment standing on the Quarantine oval, watching the PSLSC volunteers efficiently undertaking all the of the duties required and ensuring that when issues arose, they were quickly resolved, without fanfare or disruption to the event. I also had the great pleasure of watching one of our 70+ swimmers come across the line with his daughter this year after competing in the mixed class event. This was an inspiring and special moment, as only 12 months earlier he had had a life-threatening medical event on the finish line, where he was revived by the PSLSC team and later under-went heart surgery. These moments are the things that epitomize what we do as lifesavers and the importance of what we learn. These events, and the money they raise, are so important to all lifesaving clubs, not

just PSLSC, as they help ensure our training programs and other initiatives can be facilitated.

We cannot thank the sponsors of the event enough. Their commitment, and belief in what we could achieve, was critical in allowing us to move forward with the confidence required to effectively deliver the event.























