PRESIDENT'S FOREWORD



At the risk of repeating myself, I again find myself shaking my head and wondering what a 'normal' season will be like? Despite the many and varied challenges, we have had an exceptional season on fronts, in particular lifesaving, education and

development of our members, and member engagement.

We have now been in our new home for two seasons, and I am pleased to say it serves us very well. Over the past twelve months we have had many other Clubs, and most recently Lifesaving Victoria, come and meet with us to pick our brains on what we'd do differently. The response: not much. Our Clubhouse is serving as a great platform for our members to engage with each other, and engage with the activities of the club. This season our membership grew by a further 15%, and now sits just under 5,000 members. Thank you all for your continuing support, which ensures that our lifesaving and development programs not only run, but get better and better every year.

This season we had a remarkable 536 members sign on for patrols across the season, up from 435 last year and clearly a record for our Club. These members recorded 7,110 hours of patrolling the beach, up from 6,164 hours last season and made a great contribution to the community. Well done to all who have played a part in keeping our beach safe.

Despite the many challenges created by the uncertainty of the COVID-19 restrictions late last year, our education programs again delivered. We were delighted to welcome aboard United Energy as the principal partner of our education programs. With this support, we have some bold plans to expand our education activities within and beyond the Club, to make an even greater impact on lifesaving across the Mornington Peninsula and beyond.

Nippers completely sold out at 600, our biggest yet, supported by more age group managers and water safety support than ever before. Also at capacity were our SRC and Cadet programs, our modified Bronze camps and Part Time Bronze. It was great to see so many people keen to obtain new awards and further their journey in lifesaving.

The Club increased its operating hours across the season, and proved a popular meeting place for members and their guests despite generally poor weather across the peak period. More than fifty of our members gained employment opportunities, and we again saw the return of the in-demand Bridge classes. Yoga and pilates proved a great way to start the day and the Portsea SLSC Book Club provided yet another way to increase engagement opportunities for our members.

As far as events go, Portsea bucked the trend, offering Victorian swimmers the first mass participation swim post-lockdowns with the Portsea Swim Classic, and

following up a month later with a modified Pier to Perignon. We also added the Portsea All Star Golf Day to the calendar of events, with its first edition running at capacity and delivering a great day for all who took part.

Our competition teams also excelled, particularly in the Youth/Open and Masters age groups. Recent months have also seen the re-establishment of the Portsea IRB Racing Team, who have been training hard and are just entering their season now.

Undoubtedly we have packed a lot in to the season, and there are many people deserving of thanks for the hours of work they have done. Without this work, none of it happens. This season we had the added dimension of requiring COVID Safe plans for all activities, led by our Honorary Medical Officer Dr Natalie Hood, and implemented across all operations, programs and events. All subcommittees did an exceptional job, it is simply not fair to name one or two, so I encourage you to read on in the Boomer for what they've been up to. (One exception is the Facilities Subcommittee, who are responsible for management and maintenance of the clubhouse, again well done).

To all our paid employees, led by General Manager Wayne Stoll, I say thanks. You play a key role in ensuring that the welcoming culture of the club is on show to all who spend time at The Club.

To our Patron Rob Fildes, again I thank you for your ongoing support which is greatly appreciated and not taken for granted.

Finally, to the Club Committee, thank you for your commitment and support in a difficult year. Jess, Brett, Angelo, Rob, Jacqui, Priscilla, Andrew, James, Sue and Chris. I thank you. It has been one season we will all remember! Stay safe and see you on the beach,

SECRETARY'S REPORT



Through a combination of good luck, persistence and good management, the Club was able to deliver an almost normal season this year, despite the regulatory and logistical constraints that came with operating in the midst of a global pandemic.

In October 2020, as the Committee was planning the impending season, Victoria was enduring a severe lockdown, there was no certainty that the club would be able to open over summer, and there was no information about the restrictions we could possibly face. In that air of uncertainty, the Committee agreed two principles to guide our planning that would serve to maximise our chances of operating as normally as possible:

1. We would continue to plan to operate until we knew for certain that we could not operate. Even when it looked highly unlikely that restrictions would be lifted for summer, we continued to plan for the remote possibility that we would operate.
2. All plans considered that events could be cancelled or restricted at short notice and required contingency plans to minimise financial and operational risks. This placed a significantly higher burden on our organizing teams to plan for multiple scenarios.

Many other clubs were unfortunately forced to cancel events rather than take on the risk of cancellation, but thanks to the tenacity and tolerance of the Portsea volunteers, we were able to keep our options open for as long as possible, and as luck would have it, restrictions cleared in our favour and we were able to operate all our major events with well-planned modifications where required. From my point of view this is the clubs most significant achievement of the year and the Committee and indeed all our members owe a vote of thanks to the teams who tirelessly planned and carried out our events this year.

Aside from the challenges presented by COVID-19, the club faced unusual challenges presented by its dramatic growth in recent years, both in member numbers and the breadth of members services on offer. In defiance of the pandemic, our membership grew to almost 5,000, making Portsea the largest Victorian SLSC by a factor of three, and one of the largest clubs in Australia. As you will read in this Annual Report, the range of services offered to members has increased significantly as we try to cater for all segments of our membership.

Understandably, the complexity of operating the club and the workload required has increased manifold in recent years the club has welcomed all offers to pitch in from our members. We have now passed the point where we can feasibly rely on volunteers to perform all management functions, and as a result we are building a small, paid club administration team to handle a number of important functions. I would like to thank our administrative staff who took on roles with the club this year, in particular: Michelle Muter, Pam Taverniti, Mietta Mellor, Lottie Molnar, Mark Grooby and James Nola.

I would like to especially thank Emmaline Paterson, who has moved on after serving eight years of quiet achievement delivering a broad range of administrative services to the club. Most of Emmaline's work is invisible to our membership but she has approached it diligently with a smile over an

extended period. Her contribution is greatly appreciated.

We have continued to implement improvements to the management functions at the club, including the engagement of an outsourced financial services provider, Slate Accounts, to handle accounting functions such as bookkeeping, payables and payroll. This has greatly improved the efficiency of handling the higher financial transaction load that the club now demands.

This year the Committee welcomed five new members, in Sue Crow, Priscilla Brown, Andrew May, James Nola and Jacqui Hart. Despite COVID restrictions limiting committee meetings to online meetings, these new members embraced their roles and contributed to a collaborative and cohesive group under the leadership of Matt Mahon. As a testament to how much fun we are having, ten of our eleven Committee members from this year are intending to nominate for another year, the exception being Chris Perrott, who leaves us after two impactful years as Lifesaving Director to focus on his medical training and his new role as a member of the Westpac Life Saver Rescue Helicopter crew. With Angelo and I going into our seventh year as Treasurer and Club Secretary respectively, we will be looking for candidates to hand over to over the next twelve months so the club can benefit from fresh ideas and approaches.

The new membership policy and fee structure which was approved by members at last years AGM was well received by the membership and has served the club well. The Committee is happy that the policy is working as planned and intends to retain it unchanged for the coming season.

Our Member Protection Officers, Sue Traynor and Sam Paynter have proven to be an excellent combination in handling the range of issues that come their way. The nature and incidence of cases that are referred to them indicates that they play a vital role in servicing our members needs.

I would like to acknowledge the generous support provided by Jeremy Smith this year as our honorary solicitor. His advice at critical times is highly valuable to the club.

Dr Natalie Hood continued in her role as honorary medical officer, as well as taking on a formal COVID-19 Officer role. Natalie's dedication to the club and the lifesaving movement in general is highly appreciated.

Ian Campbell continued his pursuit of club memorabilia and historical artefacts has resulted in a valuable record of the club's evolution. His continued work in publishing the club's annual reports is also greatly appreciated.

Next year we will focus on continuing to improve the clubs management functions by establishing an information technology subcommittee (ITSC) to look at improving the complex array of systems and technology that we rely on to run the club. As a visible first step, we plan to deliver a major upgrade to the club website.

EDUCATION DIRECTOR'S REPORT



The 2020-21 season was with unique challenges but despite the unconventional year, Portsea's Summer Education programs were able to be run with great success.

The Part-time Bronze course kicked off the education programs for the season, led by Henry Kiss and Jim Unkles,

which successfully saw twenty candidates complete their Bronze Medallion. As a program that started virtually, we were lucky that the program could be completed face to face from the second session onwards!! Congrats to all candidates on obtaining their Bronze and thank you to Henry and Jim for running another great course!

Our amazing Bronze Chiefs, Instructors and Water Safety rose to the challenge of organising and running a Bronze camp, which only got the official go ahead five days before the proposed first day of Bronze camp! We had a great group of 74 candidates, split across two camps, to make it possible to run this year's Bronze at our regular capacity. We had some amazing weather for the camp and I think all participants enjoyed kicking off the summer spending time at the back beach with friends and obtaining their Bronze Medallion! A massive congrats and thank you to Claire Tucker-Morrison and Andrew May for their amazing leadership during the two-week period of Bronze Camp.

Next up was the SRC program, which was the biggest senior education program run this year with 86 participants obtaining their Surf Rescue Certificate award. Chiefs, Eliza Lamb and Steph Mahon, did an incredible job of organising and managing this program. Running a successful SRC is a difficult task in any year and even more so when having to factor in COVID-19 restrictions, including group sizes and the re-introduction of compulsory mask wearing mid-program! This program resulted in a wave of inspired 13 year olds obtaining their Surf Rescue Certificate, now eager to patrol the beach!

In a year where many clubs across Victoria chose to not run education programs or camps, we decided to introduce a new one! This year Portsea ran its first ever SRC-to-Cadets bridging program, to allow our keen candidates, who did not have their SRC, to partake in the Cadets program. Jack White and Domi Hart did a fantastic job leading and running this new program, which involved water skills, CPR and first aid, making sure the candidates could obtain the SRC award.

To ring in the new year was Cadet Camp with our leadership team of Griffin Mitchell and Oscar Hunter running the program and Murdoch Hunter coordinating water safety. Throughout Cadet Camp, participants were given the opportunity to improve their board handling skills and enhancing their first aid and CPR skills learnt in their SRC. No surprises that our 2020-21 Cadet Camp was a success and we look forward to seeing all our successful candidates progress to the next stage in their lifesaving journeys.

Finally, I would like to extend a massive thank you to all our Chiefs, Instructors, Water Safety, Trainers and Assessors who were involved in education programs and requalification this year; you are essential in the running of The Club and we are all very grateful for your contribution!

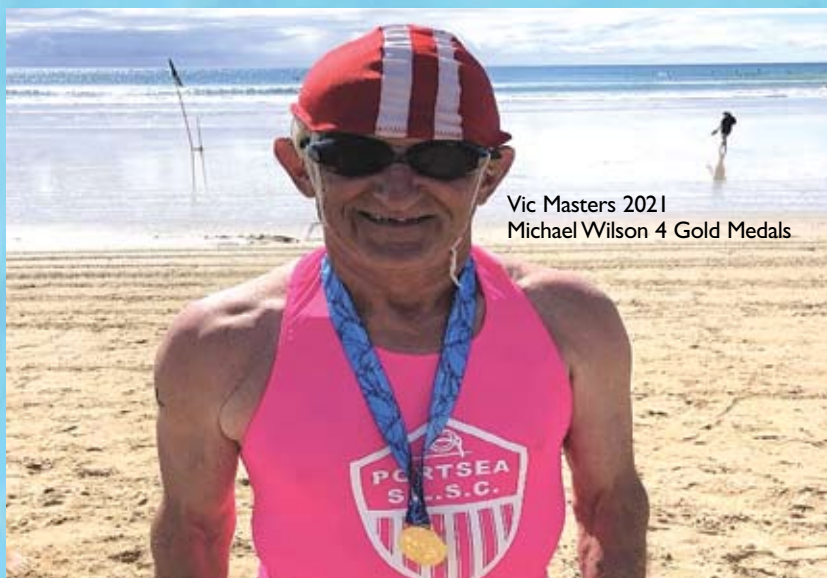

MEMBERSHIP AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Mostly, Membership and Leadership Development (MLD) is a role that focuses on member engagement and development in programs throughout the year, which are conducted by both Portsea SLSC and Life Saving Victoria. This season I took over the role of MLD officer from Jacqui Hart, who did an amazing job at establishing MLD programs at Portsea and promoting involvement in Life Saving Victoria.

I have been fortunate enough to be involved with Portsea SLSC my whole life, from under 7 Nippers, all the way through to achieving my Gold Medallion and being a Lifeguard for five seasons. Surf Life Saving has granted me incredible opportunities for self-growth and development and personal enrichment through both Portsea run programs, such as Nippers, Cadets, Bronze, Silver, and LSV programs such as Advanced Lifesaving Camp (ALC), and the Building Leaders Scholarship.

Unfortunately, due to the difficult climate in 2020, many Leadership and Development Camps were unable to go ahead. However, some programs were still able to happen through a virtual medium. Even due to these set-backs, Portsea still had amazing MLD involvement in LSV's camps. Andrew Argyrou was also able to attend an LSV program over zoom as a Mentee on the LSV Mentor-Mentee program, and Emily Mellor has also taken on a role with SLSA as a Mentor. We also had a large number of members who were accepted on LSV-run camps, which were unfortunately cancelled due to COVID-19 restrictions.

One of the most recent camps was the LSV U13 Development camp held at Lake Dewar from the 16th-18th April. Portsea had fantastic representation with attendees, Bella Murchie, Annabelle Mahon and Mia Horskins, along with Camp Leaders Hamish Mckendrick and Laura Cantwell. All five members thoroughly enjoyed the camp and highly recommended it to everyone thinking of applying for the camp next year!

This season, Portsea also ran its first ever PINK patrol, aimed at encouraging female involvement and engagement in Life Saving. The patrol happened to fall on one of the busiest days of the year at the Back Beach but nevertheless, the strong women (and some men!) patrolling made sure everyone had a great time and there were no lives lost.

This season there are many more MLD events that members can get involved with. LSV will be running Female Leadership Network events throughout the year and season that are open to females and males over 18 to attend. 'Blue Connections' is an LSV initiative encouraging connection within the broader lifesaving community through monthly events, focusing on personal development.

Finally, we are launching some amazing Portsea based member engagement events during the off season, so keep an eye out for info in the eBoomers and on social media to get involved! EQUIPMENT DIRECTOR'S REPORT



The 2020-21 season has certainly been full of surprises and challenges, but beyond all else it has been full of selfless and diligent volunteers who ensured that our Club could carry out its duty to the wider community. The praise and admiration our Club has received from the community and the lifesaving world has been nonpareil, and I would like to join the masses in thanking every single member for their contribution.

In my first season as the Portsea SLSC Equipment Director, there are some absolute certainties that I have established about Portsea and our equipment. We need lots of it, we have lots of it, and we certainly use lots of it. I truly didn't imagine I would ever walk into the new equipment room and proclaim, "There's not enough equipment, we need more!", but I did, over and over again. From the 800 daily Nippers and their vigilant instructors beside them on surf rescue boards, to the momentous open-water swims, with truly exceptional water safety teams, it is evident that our Club's rate of growth and development genuinely exceeds my expectations and our gear room's capacity for equipment. I can only conclude this is a good thing, and I encourage it going forward. I simply must work harder to ensure a surplus of operational gear for all clubbies to use.

I am hopeful that during the off-season, with the help of the Club's Operational Committee, the equipment room will finally be completed (as 2020's surprises hindered the last few additions). New racking and storage will be installed, making use of the roof and other areas to fit more equipment. A compressed air system will be mounted, allowing for pressurising of tyres, IRBs and inflatable boards, as well as the drying of engines after they have been washed. Changes will also be made to the equipment room's arrangement to allow for safer thoroughfare and movement of equipment. Finally, to the joy of many avid board paddlers, new 'Kracka' surf rescue boards will be purchased to bolster our fleet of highly used boards. As always, I appreciate your help and opinions with the management of our equipment, so please let me know any ideas or suggestions you may have to improve our gear for next season!

This year, the Portsea IRB racing team has been revived through the efforts of nearly twenty fresh and keen boat racers. Training commenced in late February and has continued weekly until now, developing our experienced patrollers from largely untried and untested racers to a competitive force in the racing world. Given the increased requirement for speed and safety in the cut-throat IRB competition, many hours of training, studying rules, engine work and boat testing still remain between now and our first carnivals. We are always looking for officials to aid at IRB carnivals, and I encourage anyone who has an interest in this sport to contact the Portsea IRB team, head down to watch, offer support, and to get involved!

Lastly, I would like to say a huge thanks to the wider club membership, but particularly the Clubs Committee, who have all taught me so much in my first season as Equipment Director. To a new member on the Committee, your wisdom and assistance in understanding the wider world of lifesaving, to legal structures and financial statements is priceless. I aspire to reciprocate your efforts by providing an even greater quality of equipment next year!

COMPETITION REPORT



The restart of the LSV COVID era competition proved no less challenging than what was occurring in other sports. Carnivals are non-ticketed events at open beaches, with people moving about to compete in teams,

sharing equipment, and not always able to socially distance. Despite this, as was the case throughout all our club activities, we learnt to adjust. Our team stayed very connected all through the Victorian lockdowns. We logged in with QR codes, trained in pairs, then in small groups. We held Zoom sessions, we joined Strava apps, we posted training photos to keep others motivated and we came out the other end with a bigger, stronger, more successful team than we had pre-COVID.

Competitive racing aside, keeping our patrolling members fit, healthy, skilled and engaged is vitally important. Member retention is also important to our club and its future and competition is one more string to our bow as Victorias '2020 Club of the Year'. We thank the Portsea SLSC Committee and our general club members for their support of our team as we strive to represent our club to the best of our ability in the aquatic sporting arenas.

The first casualty of COVID cancellations was the 2020 IRB racing season. Under the guidance of our Portsea SLSC Equipment Director Andrew May, a team had been assembled, rescue boats prepped and training commenced. Unfortunately lockdowns put an end to all plans and the team put the racing boats under wrap until the re-start of the 2021 winter season.

Once sporting competition was allowed under our new 'COVID normal' the Portsea Competition Teams, both Junior and Senior proved themselves to be engaged, not only with each other, but with other Life Saving Clubs. Whilst the LSV season was on hold, we joined in a number of intra-club competitions with Mentone, Mordialloc, Torquay and Elwood. When the official events recommenced in January, we sent small representative teams to all of the events.

Training over December - March ran at multiple venues both in Melbourne and on the peninsula. The Junior team held training at both Quarantine and the Back Beach. A new initiative this summer was to upskill some of our senior members with their SLSA Foundation Coaching Award and pay them for their services in training our younger members. Tom Regan, Chloe Dowling and Steph Hunter were warmly appreciated, especially as they helped with surfing skills at the Back Beach. The senior team training had a focus this year on ocean swimming and engaged the services of multi-time winner of the Lorne Pier to Pub, Sam Sheppard, who coached our swimmers both in flat water and surf swimming.

The first big weekend of competition was the double header at Lorne, the 2021 Masters Championships and the LSV Youth/Senior Carnival. The Masters Team was smaller than usual as the beach events were held separately at Altona. Despite this they packed a punch, with multiple medals around multiple necks. The standout was Michael 'Whippy' Wilson who won four GOLD medals at Vics, in the 70-74 years Swim, Board, Ski and Ironman. At the Masters Beach events Henry Kiss took out GOLD in the 50-54 Beach Sprint and Flags.

The Portsea Competition Team arrived at the 2021 Victorian Championships as an unknown underdog. With our quality team of competitors across the ocean, beach and boat arenas coming together, we arrived with purpose, and left stamping our mark on the top 10, placing 7th out of the 23 clubs competing, with 153.5 points, up from 95.5 points in 13th at the previous state titles in 2019.

In summary the Youth/Senior team won 13 GOLD medals, 7 SILVER medals and 5 BRONZE medals. Our stand out individual medallists were Steph Hunter with 3 GOLD and 1 SILVER in her U17 individual events and Harvey Larke with 3 individual GOLD medals and 2 team GOLD medals the U17 Men's team, plus our Beach Team lead by Griffin Mitchell and Oscar Hunter achieving a haul of 10 medals on the sand. Stephen Blewett swept our Open Women's Boat Crew to a SILVER medal in the surf boat events.

The Junior Victorian Championships, held once again in Warrnambool, were restricted by numbers to only the U12 and U13 age groups. The Portsea Team was represented by four girls in each of the U12 and U13 arenas, plus Patrick Benson in the U12 boys. Sophie Jacka saw the rewards of her intense training program and came home with two GOLD medals in the U13 Iron and Swim, plus the overall LSV 'Ocean Athlete of the Season'.

After no national events last year, our Portsea team was very excited at the chance of returning to compete at Aussies 2021. We had 37 entrants across the four carnivals, Youth, Masters, the 2km Ocean Swim and Open Aussies. The Youth were up first and we had five boys and five girls lining up in the U14 and U15 events. For all of them this was their first real taste of competition at a national level and a realisation of just how tough it is to even make it through a round of any event. Mackie Hunter raced through to the semi-final of the U15 Iron event and along with Gemma Woolrich went through to the semi-finals of the U15 Surf Race. The team spirit was amazing and all our team members learnt skills that they will be bring back home for next season. The racing finished with a team dinner at the Maroochydore RSL, where nearly fifty Portsea touring team members, family and supporters celebrated the carnival events together.

Next up were the Masters, highlighted by our SILVER medal in the 170+ Men's Beach Relay with Brett Croft, Jim Unkles, Darren Kerr and Henry Kiss performing for the crowd of Red and White supporters. In the water events we had numerous combinations of ages racing in swim, ski, and Taplin teams, everyone enjoying the camaraderie of years of training, racing and patrolling together.

The finale was the Open Aussies where we had ten U17-U19 competitors, plus a couple of Masters helping out the teams. Highlights from the U17 men included Xavier Purcell reaching the final of the U17 Surf Race, placing 23rd, plus an amazing performance by Ned Betts, Harvey Larke and Xavier Purcell making the final of the U17 Board Relay, even more impressive given they are all bottom age, coming off a winter of Melbourne's COVID lockdowns. In the U17 women's arena Steph Hunter made the final of the U17 Belt Race, placing 7th. She then teamed up with Georgie Kerr, Charlotte Mahon and Sophie Courtney to race as many other individual and team events as they could. It was great to see these four young women, who raced Aussies together two years ago as U15's, return again to the sport they love. Down in the beach arena at Mooloolaba our U19 men Griffin Mitchell and Oscar Hunter crossed between distance running and sprinting. Their best result was 5th in the 2 x 1km relay, and 4th in the U19 Beach Relay, where they paired up with Ned Betts and Charlie Deacon. The surf boat events at Alexandra Headlands culminated with a 5th placing in the final by our Open Women's Boat crew of Amanda Rukuwai, Amelia McColl, Emily von Moger, Alexandra Hagan and Stephen Blewett (sweep).

After the winter of lockdowns, pool closures, forbidden group training, on-line zoom exercising and a very restricted local carnival season, to take such a huge team to the Aussies Championships a true statement of the resilience of our athletes, and the strength of the support around them to keep them motivated and the wheels of our team organization, well-greased for the bounce back. Thank you to our officials and water-safety. Without you we can't even enter carnivals. To our managers, Amanda Benson and Matt Colston (Junior), Andrew Regan (Youth/Senior), Dwight Harrison (Masters) and Stephen Blewett (Boats and LSV Delegate), our LSV Aquatic Sports Council Executive member and team administrator Natalie Hood, our logistics manager Anthony Purcell, ocean coach Marni Jacka, ski coach Charlie Schall-Riaucour, and to all our other sub-committee members and parents, please all take credit for your part in making the season 20/21 happen with the enjoyment and success that we have all shared, becoming better, stronger members of our great club Portsea.

Lorne turned it on for the 2021 Masters, with perfect 2-3 foot surf and a sunny, 26-degree day. Life Saving Victoria spread this years Masters event across two days of competition, with water events held at Lorne and beach events held at Altona

two weeks later due to COVID restrictions.

Participant numbers from all clubs, including Portsea, were well down on previous years due to the impacts of COVID and the five-day snap lockdown the week prior to the Lorne competition. However, our team was extremely dedicated and motivated to bring surf lifesaving competition back to life. This year our team consisted of a powerful, strong, skilled and experienced group of competitors. They all managed to continue training through the COVID lockdowns by bench pressing their children, running the streets with tyres tied behind them, or swimming in the bay in 10-degree water in speedos, then punishing themselves once out of lockdown in November and grinding eight weeks of hard training back in the pool, skis, boards and running before Lorne. It was a marvellous effort by all to get to Lorne and wear our Red and White.

Our ski team were first in the water, and didn't our team go nuts! Charlie Schall-Riaucour, Matt Mahon, Dave Flockart and Whippy Wilson shone in their races, with all receiving medals. Our ski team deserves special credit for their massive improvement gained from training over the last year. It was brilliant to see Charlie, Matty and Dave show not just their fitness but real skills and technique.

While the skis were racing, our women's team started their campaign with Annabel White and Lyndall Willis taking on 300 competitors from other clubs. And didn't our Portsea team shine too, winning gold medals together in the board rescue with Lyndall swimming and Annabel paddling.

Annabel and Lyndall then both raced in individual swims and board races, placing well. Annabel won silver in the board race 35yrs and gold in the surf race 35yrs. It would be fantastic to see more women competing with Lyndall and Annabel so Portsea can field competitors in more events next year.

We are lucky to have the legend of surf lifesaving, Michael (Whippy) Wilson, competing in his 70s. Whippy dominated his age bracket and won Gold in four events, Ironman, Ski Race, Board Race and Surf Race. We had to send for security to protect him from the crowd and prevent his gold medals from being stolen! Whippy shows us all that age is no barrier and we can all stay fit and keep racing.

In the race of races, the Ironman, Cameron Hunter and Dwight Harrison took to the line for the over 50yrs event against the cream of the state's masters competitors, although they seemed to be more interested in beating each other than the rest of the field! Cameron hit the beach first, but collapsed with a torn calf muscle, unable to run to the finish line. Without a second thought, the second and third placed competitors stopped to pick Camo up and carry him over the line, providing the best example of what Masters competition is all about. Camo was wheelchair bound and unable to race for the remainder of the day but had the comfort of a gold medal around his neck.

Throughout the day, Henry Kiss was officiating for us with LSV, and we thank Henry again for his service and support.

Two weeks after the surf events at Lorne, Henry competed at Altona beach in the masters beach events. Henry was our only Masters competitor available on the day, as the Pier to Perignon swim was on the same day.

Henry dominated proceedings and kept our Portsea Red and White colours flying. Henry won Gold in both the 50yrs beach spirit and the 50yrs beach flags. If the rules had allowed, he might have done all four legs of the beach relay and won that as well!

Amidst state-level COVID lockdowns, the Australian Masters Championships managed to find a window to run on the Sunshine Coast and Portsea was represented by Cameron Hunter, Dave Flockart, Matt Mahon, Anthony Purcell, Brett Croft, Henry Kiss, Natalie Hunter, Jimmy Unkles, Darren (Spot) Kerr and new member from the dark side (Anglesea), Stu Larke.

Cameron, Matt and Dave paddled in ski events, making finals. Anthony and Stu raced in the swim events, also making finals but medals were hard to come by in such an elite field. Henry, Spot, Jim and Brett made the final in beach relay and won the Silver medal.

Natalie was our only female competitor but sadly snapped her Achilles tendon in the board race, requiring surgery and months of rehabilitation.

It was a great effort by the masters competitors, who all did well, and stayed to support our junior and senior competition team racing in the Australian titles.

This is my last year as masters Captain to make way for new blood (younger blood) to help build the team and attract more competitors in the 30 year and 40 year age brackets. I will continue to support and race masters and hopefully others who didn't race this year will come back next year. The club will be looking to future leaders such as Annabel White to build the numbers in the womens team and the likes of Jim Unkles, Nick Tissot and Matt Perrot to build the next era of Masters competition at Portsea.

MAJOR EVENTS

Portsea Swim Classic



Well, what a year to take over the running of Portsea Swim Classic event. On the 23rd January 2021, the Portsea Swim Classic celebrated its 35th continuous year as an open water swimming event. The fact that we were, unlike nearly every

other open water swims in Victoria in January, able to deliver this event, is a testament to the single-minded determination by the Portsea SLSC to never say never.

I would like you to cast your mind back to a period in August 2020, when we as a State were gripped with lockdowns and an unknown future. That was the backdrop at the time, when a decision by the swim sub-committee, fully supported by the club committee, was made to do everything we could, to ensure that we gave PSLSC the best chance of being able to deliver the Portsea Swim Classic in 2021. We believed this was a worthwhile exercise on several levels, but the one that resonated the strongest, was a desire to deliver something for the community to look forward to, especially given the situation where so many other events were either cancelling or moving to a virtual platform. The Portsea Swim Classic is an event so many people enjoy and both the physical and mental benefits could not be underestimated.

We discussed the situation with our sponsors and found a willingness from them all to give it a go. I wish to thank our major sponsor Blazer and our gold sponsors, Crestone Wealth Management and Grainshaker, for their support. With this support, multiple plans were put together to accommodate for various scenarios, as well as detailed strategies to minimize the possible costs that the Club might incur to enable this opportunity. One strategy that we were very proud of, was that unlike other years where all the merchandise, as well as swimming caps, were branded with the year of the swim, this year, the number 35 was used to represent the number of years the swim had been running for. If we had to take the drastic decision of cancelling the event, the merchandise could be used the following year, thus minimizing the financial risk to the Club, as well as our major sponsor Blazer, who so graciously supplies the T-Shirts and caps for the event on an annual basis.

Once we agreed on staging the Swim Classic, the sub-committee dedicated themselves to delivering the event, spending an enormous amount of time putting all the necessary documents in place and negotiating with all the various authorities to get the multiple permits required. During this period, the very real possibility of all the work being done for no result, was a constant concern. We concentrated on the ability, if given the opportunity, to deliver a COVID-19 safe event that would allow people something to look forward to and focus on, without compromising the integrity of the surf club or the event.

After long periods of uncertainty and multiple changes as to how the event would operate, we were fortunate that when the day finally arrived, we were able to deliver what we had worked so hard to achieve. The emails and comments leading up to the event from hundreds of swimmers thanking us for not giving up and expressing their excitement of being able to do something, was a humbling experience that was amplified on the day and post the event.

As I am sure you can appreciate, the day could not have happened without the hundreds of volunteers who unselfishly gave up their time to fill all the positions that this event required. This was even more challenging, as the normal complications of running this event had been taken to a completely new level with all the COVID-19 safe measures that had to be included.

To enable the event to operate, some of the things we needed to do were:

- Run it as two completely independent events on the same day to ensure people limits on numbers were maintained.
- Change the registration process to incorporate contact tracing using QR codes, backed up by the transponders.
- Have four separate points where contact tracing could be facilitated.
- Change our transponders to disposable ones to allow for all the systems and tracing to operate.
- Change our registration platform.
- Change our merchandise collection system.
- Change the complete layout of both the Quarantine area and the start line.
- Implement the necessary systems to enable safe distancing to occur.
- Implement transportation and start line marshalling initiatives, that included mandatory face masks and hand sanitiser.

It was a proud moment standing on the Quarantine oval, watching the PSLSC volunteers efficiently undertaking all of the duties required and ensuring that when issues arose, they were quickly resolved. This could not have been more evident than when we had one of our 70+ year old competitors, who had just won the male division, suffer a heart attack at the finish line. He was immediately attended to by the lifesavers and medical staff who conducted the necessary procedures to revive him. He was treated further with the help of St John ambulance and then transported by another ambulance to hospital, where next day he underwent his cardiac restoration procedure. Because of where he was and who was there to aid him, he is now on the road to a full recovery. This single incident highlights what it is to be a part of PSLSC and emphasizes, more than anything, what we as a surf club aim to achieve. As a surf club, we can provide a safe event that helps thousands of people and financially aids the Club deliver its services.

In supporting the Club and volunteering your time, you are also ensuring that we can make a real difference on the beach and at our events, but more importantly in everyday life. One of the first

responders to the above situation had only just completed their Bronze Medallion. Within a short period of time, the training that he had received gave him the ability to aid in saving a life. It is exciting to think that the children and young adults who complete the education programmes that PSLSC provides, all have this same capability.

Once again, I would like to personally thank the PSLSC Swim Classic sub-committee members and all the volunteers who, without question, gave their time to deliver this event. Without their dedication and commitment, this massive event would not have happened. It was an extremely challenging year, which I am proud to say, in these circumstances, we came out on top.

No other significant changes in the association's state of affairs occurred during the financial year.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2021

The financial report is for Portsea Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Portsea Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an association incorporated in Victoria and operating pursuant to the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

Portsea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc applies Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements as set out in AASB 1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012. The entity is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

Accounting Policies

a. Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Grant revenue is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income when the association obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the association and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

If conditions are attached to the grant which must be satisfied before it is eligible to receive the contribution, the recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

When grant revenue is received whereby the association incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt.

Portsea Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for zero or a nominal value. These assets are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the statement of financial position, with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the statement of comprehensive income.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

b. Income Tax exemption

As a Public Benevolent Institution, the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

c.. Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

c. **Property, Plant and Equipment**

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair values as indicated, less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost or for nominal cost are valued and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised lease assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight line basis over the asset's useful life to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Buildings	2.5%
Fixture & Fittings	14%
Plant and equipment	33%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each statement of financial position date.

Asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

d. **Financial Instruments**

Initial Recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Association becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is the date that the Association commits itself to either the purchase or sale of the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted).

Financial instruments (except for trade receivables) are initially measured at fair value plus transaction costs, except where the instrument is classified "at fair value through profit or loss", in which case transaction costs are expensed to profit or loss immediately. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

Trade receivables are initially measured at the transaction price if the trade receivables do not contain a significant financing component.

Classification and subsequent measurement

Financial Liabilities

Financial liabilities are subsequently measured at:

- amortised cost; or
- fair value through profit or loss.

A financial liability is measured at fair value through profit or loss if the financial liability is:

- a contingent consideration of an acquirer in a business combination to which AASB 3 :*Business Combinations* applies;
- held for trading; or
- initially designated as at fair value through profit or loss.

All other financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a debt instrument and of allocating interest expense in profit or loss over the relevant period.

The effective interest rate is the internal rate of return of the financial asset or liability, that is, it is the rate that exactly discounts the estimated future cash flows through the expected life of the instrument to the net carrying amount at initial recognition.

A financial liability is held for trading if it is:

- incurred for the purpose of repurchasing or repaying in the near term;
- part of a portfolio where there is an actual pattern of short-term profit taking; or
- a derivative financial instrument (except for a derivative that is in a financial guarantee contract or a derivative that is in an effective hedging relationship).

Any gains or losses arising on changes in fair value are recognised in profit or loss to the extent that they are not part of a designated hedging relationship.

The change in fair value of the financial liability attributable to changes in the issuer's credit risk is taken to other comprehensive income and is not subsequently reclassified to profit or loss. Instead, it is transferred to retained earnings upon derecognition of the financial liability.

If taking the change in credit risk in other comprehensive income enlarges or creates an accounting mismatch, then these gains or losses should be taken to profit or loss rather than other comprehensive income.

A financial liability cannot be reclassified.

Financial assets

Financial assets are subsequently measured at:

- amortised cost;
- fair value through other comprehensive income; or
- fair value through profit or loss.

Measurement is on the basis of two primary criteria:

- the contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial asset; and
- the business model for managing the financial assets.

A financial asset that meets the following conditions is subsequently measured at amortised cost:

- the contractual terms within the financial asset give rise to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding on specified dates; and
- the business model for managing the financial asset comprises both contractual cash flows collection and the selling of the financial asset.

By default, all other financial assets that do not meet the measurement conditions of amortised cost and fair value through other comprehensive income are subsequently measured at fair value through profit or loss.

The Association initially designates a financial instrument as measured at fair value through profit or loss if:

- it eliminates or significantly reduces a measurement or recognition inconsistency (often referred to as an "accounting mismatch") that would otherwise arise from measuring assets or liabilities or recognising the gains and losses on them on different bases;

- it is in accordance with the documented risk management or investment strategy and information about the grouping is documented appropriately, so the performance of the financial liability that is part of a group of financial liabilities or financial assets can be managed and evaluated consistently on a fair value basis; and
- it is a hybrid contract that contains an embedded derivative that significantly modifies the cash flows otherwise required by the contract.

The initial designation of the financial instruments to measure at fair value through profit or loss is a one-time option on initial classification and is irrevocable until the financial asset is derecognised.

Regular way purchases and sales of financial assets are recognised and derecognised at settlement date in accordance with the Association's accounting policy.

Derecognition

Derecognition refers to the removal of a previously recognised financial asset or financial liability from the statement of financial position.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

A liability is derecognised when it is extinguished (i.e. when the obligation in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires). An exchange of an existing financial liability for a new one with substantially modified terms, or a substantial modification to the terms of a financial liability, is treated as an extinguishment of the existing liability and recognition of a new financial liability.

The difference between the carrying amount of the financial liability derecognised and the consideration paid and payable, including any non-cash assets transferred or liabilities assumed, is recognised in profit or loss.

Derecognition of financial assets

A financial asset is derecognised when the holder's contractual rights to its cash flows expires, or the asset is transferred in such a way that all the risks and rewards of ownership are substantially transferred.

All the following criteria need to be satisfied for the derecognition of a financial asset:

- the right to receive cash flows from the asset has expired or been transferred;
- all risk and rewards of ownership of the asset have been substantially transferred; and
- the Association no longer controls the asset (i.e. it has no practical ability to make unilateral decisions to sell the asset to a third party).

On derecognition of a financial asset measured at amortised cost, the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the sum of the consideration received and receivable is recognised in profit or loss.

On derecognition of a debt instrument classified as fair value through other comprehensive income, the cumulative gain or loss previously accumulated in the investment revaluation reserve is reclassified to profit or loss.

On derecognition of an investment in equity which the Association elected to classify under fair value through other comprehensive income, the cumulative gain or loss previously accumulated in the investments revaluation reserve is not reclassified to profit or loss, but is transferred to retained earnings.

Impairment

The Association recognises a loss allowance for expected credit losses on:

- financial assets that are measured at amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income;
- lease receivables;
- contract assets (e.g. amount due from customers under construction contracts);
- loan commitments that are not measured at fair value through profit or loss; and
- financial guarantee contracts that are not measured at fair value through profit or loss.

Loss allowance is not recognised for:

- financial assets measured at fair value through profit or loss; or
- equity instruments measured at fair value through other comprehensive income.

Expected credit losses are the probability-weighted estimate of credit losses over the expected life of a financial instrument. A credit loss is the difference between all contractual cash flows that are due and all cash flows expected to be received, all discounted at the original effective interest rate of the financial instrument.

The Association uses the following approaches to impairment, as applicable under AASB 9 :*Financial Instruments* :

- the simplified approach;

Simplified approach

The simplified approach does not require tracking of changes in credit risk at every reporting period, but instead requires the recognition of lifetime expected credit loss at all times.

This approach is applicable to:

- trade receivables or contract assets that result from transactions that are within the scope of AASB 15: *Revenue from Contracts with Customers*, and which do not contain a significant financing component; and
- lease receivables.

In measuring the expected credit loss, a provision matrix for trade receivables is used taking into consideration various data to get to an expected credit loss (i.e. diversity of its customer base, appropriate groupings of its historical loss experience, etc).

For the year ended 30th June 2021 the Committee estimate the loss rate to be zero, therefore no ECL allowance was recognised.

e. Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date, the association reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the statement of comprehensive income.

Where the future economic benefits of the asset are not primarily dependent upon the asset's ability to generate net cash inflows and when the association would, if deprived of the asset, replace its remaining future economic benefits, value in use is determined as the depreciated replacement cost of an asset.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an assets class, the association estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the class of assets belong.

Where an impairment loss on a revalued asset is identified, this is debited against the revaluation reserve in respect of the same class of asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation reserve for that same class of asset.

f. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

g. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cashflow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

h. **Income Tax**

No provision for income tax has been raised as the association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

i. **Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at reporting date.

j. **Comparative Figures**

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

k. **Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments**

The Committee evaluate estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the association.

Property Lease

The entity only has a lease of clubhouse land which is considered a peppercorn lease (lease significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the entity to further its objectives) and the entity has not elected to measure this lease at fair value, the lease cost is considered a low-value lease and as such the entity has elected not to apply AASB 16 to this lease.

Key Estimates

Impairment

The association assesses impairment at each reporting date by evaluation of conditions and events specific to the association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

l. **New and Amended Accounting Policies Adopted by the Entity**

The association has adopted all of the new and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations applicable to its operations which became mandatory.

The adoption of these Standards has not had a significant impact on the financial statements of the association.

m. **New Accounting Standards for Application in Future Periods**

The association has not yet assessed or adopted the new simplified disclosure standard AASB1060 General Purpose Financial Statements- Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities which replaces the existing Reduced Disclosure Reporting framework. This new standard will become mandatory for the financial years starting 1 July 2021.
