

#### PRESIDENT'S FOREWORD



Community. As I look back on the season just passed, my overwhelming reflection is one of feeling grateful about belonging to the community that is the Portsea Surf Life Saving Club. Communities like

ours don't just happen. There is certainly some luck involved, but mostly it is a result of the hard work and passion that our members have given to the Club for almost 75 years. We saw it in spades this season.

Among our 5,300 members there are varying degrees of engagement and involvement in this community, and that's fine. We have some members who are completely immersed: they are at the club almost every weekend, patrolling, delivering education programs, cleaning, lugging gear or helping with the administration of the Club. Some drift in and out, some never leave, some make a ritual of helping at the swims as their annual contribution, and others just want to come down and sit on the deck three or four times a year and feel pleased to be a part of it, knowing that through their membership, they are contributing to the club. Every one of these people contributes. Our 'Portsea community' stood up big time this year.

Our education team managed to safely execute 'livein' camps in December for the first time in two years. Unbelievable really when you consider what was to follow. Part time Bronze, and live-in Bronze and Silver Medallion programs were all a success.

Our Nippers, SRC and Cadets all got a start before arguably the biggest wave ever seen at Portsea (Omicron) swept through. Again, our team of volunteers did a superb job to battle through, showing an incredible commitment to deliver these important education programs in a safe, fun environment.

Behind the scenes, our COVID plans were put into action with great support and understanding from our members, who all played a part in keeping our activities as safe as we could. It was not an easy time.

Our member food and beverage service suffered, as like many, we struggled with available workforce. Those still standing adapted, changed plans, and pleasingly our members understood and supported what service we were able to offer.

As the white water of the wave settled, our events team dusted off COVID-safe plans developed the year prior and we not only delivered our open water swims, we added a run/walk event through the Nepean National Park finishing at the clubhouse on the Back Beach.. If the workload wasn't enough, the Pier to Perignon team did it twice, with the initial event date thwarted by a 40-knot northerly.

One constant was our patrols which ran from late November until 25th April, one of the longest seasons on record. Despite the challenges, our patrollers did not miss a beat. Our volunteers recorded a total of 7,682 hours of patrolling on Portsea Back Beach, in which they directly saved 7 lives in major rescues, recorded another 2,818 preventable actions.

An amazing 462 members pulled on a red and yellow quartered cap to patrol.


Across the season there were some remarkable highs, and also some lows as our members dealt with various challenges thrown their way. As I look back, undoubtedly my key takeout for the season was the extent to which that sense of community was on show. We worked together, we saved lives together, we learned together, we partied together, we grieved together, we laughed together and we supported one another in all that we did.

At the conclusion of the lifesaving season, the Club's part time General Manager Wayne Stoll finished up in the role. Wayne played a key role in establishing the member service offering for the club, commencing in the role in the lead up to the summer of 2019/20. The Committee are incredibly grateful for Wayne's contribution to the club, and look forward to his ongoing involvement as a member.

Thank you to the almost one hundred people that contribute across various committees and working groups, to our paid staff, and to all who have been part of the Portsea community this year. We couldn't do it without you.

I can't wait for next season already. See you on the beach!

#### **CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT**



This season has been a rollercoaster of unpredictability and yet another season of tremendous accomplishment. We managed to put a patrol on the beach every single weekend, despite the impact COVID-19 had on

our active member base throughout the peak of the season. I would like to thank every single one of our patrolling members for making this possible. In particular, I would like to thank our Patrol Captains, Vice-Captains and our brand-new Lifesaving Director, Sas McNamara. It was amazing to see the way everyone rallied together to keep our beaches safe and support one another under some really trying conditions. Together, we recorded upwards of 6,000 patrol hours, performed over 2,500 preventative actions and 7 major rescues. This is an incredible feat.

Not only did we manage to excel in the lifesaving arena, but our education team also defied the odds, delivering surf lifesaving education to upwards of 1,000 members. Our Nipper program provided vital surf safety lessons and instilled water confidence in over 600 young members, including 5 Starfish Nippers at the height of the pandemic. I would like to both thank and congratulate the Nipper Subcommittee, led by Brett Croft for providing our youngest beachgoers with the opportunity to enhance their physical and mental wellbeing after 18 months of social isolation and restrictions on accessing pools and waterways. Similarly, Alex Madden and Andrew Argyrou did an incredible job to introduce Starfish Nippers to Portsea SLSC, which is a program centred around providing lifesaving education to children with disabilities. In addition to our Nipper Program, Jacqui Hart, our Education Director, led the charge to deliver development opportunities to an additional 80 SRCs, 70 Cadets, 90 Bronzies across our live-in and part-time programs and 45 Silver candidates. Thank you to all the instructors, water safety and in particular camp chiefs who made this possible.

Furthermore, not only did we manage to deliver our two major swims this season, but we also introduced a brand-new major event to our club calendar, the Bay to Surf adventure run. The event saw 450 competitors take to the start line at Quarantine station and finish at our very own surf club. This event was a massive success! It was great to see so many smiling faces running and walking along Portsea Back Beach against the backdrop of the picturesque sunset we all know and love. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped with the delivery of the day and in particular, Craig Evans. Craig's unconditional mentoring and support made this event possible.

I'd like to conclude by shedding light on the Operational Committee. These I I young members are the powerhouse of our club, managing our education programs, patrols, sustainability initiatives, events, competition, first aid, club communications, accommodation and IT systems. Thank you for your tireless efforts this season, I feel so lucky to be supported by such a strong, capable group of people.

I'm so excited for what next season has in store. We're looking forward to introducing a new education program, Portsea Platinum, which is designed to provide our Silver Camp graduates with the opportunity to practice search and rescue operations in a live-in camp setting. If you have any interest in becoming more involved in our club operations or have any ideas and/or initiatives that you'd like to see implemented, please reach out to me or any member of the Operational Committee. We're committed to continuing to grow and improve our lifesaving community. Have a great off-season, looking forward to seeing you on the beach next season!



#### SECRETARY'S REPORT



At the time of writing, COVID-19 and its attendant restrictions seem a distant memory, largely because the Club managed to navigate a second season under COVID-19 restrictions with limited impact. Our educational program bore the brunt of the COVID impact,

and our food and beverage services were constrained, but the Club's lifesaving services and major events were able to operate with limited impact in line with our COVID plans.

With the benefit of the experience of operating the 2020-2021 season under heavy restrictions, the Committee faced the 2021-2022 season with the same decision-making principles that had served the club so well in the previous year.

I.We would continue to plan to operate until we knew for certain that we could not operate.

2. All plans considered that events could be cancelled or restricted at short notice and required contingency plans to minimise financial and operational risks.

As a result, the Club was able to re-apply the valuable lessons learned from last year to deliver almost a full range of services and activities for the 2021-2022 season. Credit for this achievement deserves to be shared by all volunteers, paid staff and participating members across the club. Many of the ideas developed under the duress of the two COVID seasons will continue to be applied in future years.

Club membership numbers continued to grow in the 2021-2022 season, albeit at a slower rate than last year. Overall club membership has stabilised in the range of 5,000 members. The club's membership policy and fee structure has continued to serve the club's needs well and the Committee intends to retain it unchanged for the 2022-2023 membership year.

As the club's administration requirements continue to expand, we rely more heavily on our administrative staff. Mark Grooby has stepped into the club administrator role over the past two years and is now a critical force in the smooth operation of the club across lifesaving administration, member administration and a range of other functions. Mark was ably supported this year by Pam Taverniti in reception and club administrative functions with more of a focus on our food and beverage services. Mietta Mellor provided support services in the club reception and membership administration. We thank our hardworking administration team for their work throughout the year. The Committee plans to continue to expand the administration function to share the workload more equitably across all involved.

LSV recognised the work of Portsea's club administration team by awarding our club the Award of Excellence for Administration Club of the Year for the 2020-2021 season. I would like to congratulate our team on this achievement and thank them for their dedication.

I would also like to acknowledge Josh Nilsen who has held the volunteer role of Communications Director over the past year. Josh has taken to the role with gusto and his no-fuss approach has elevated this role within the club and simplified life for many of the club's volunteers.

The IT Steering Committee (ITSC) was established this year under the leadership of James Nola and is tackling a range of IT-related initiatives across the club. One if the first activities for the ITSC was to support the commissioning of the club's new website, which has delivered a major improvement to the club's online presence. For the 2022-2023 year, James will hand over the leadership of this group to Michael Hill. We thank all members of the ITSC for their contribution.

This year the Committee welcomed one new member in Sas McNamara in the role of Lifesaving Director, replacing Chris Perrott. Sas has applied her energy and creativity to the role and has made a significant impact in her first year. We thank Chris for his sustained contribution to the Committee and to the club in general.

My 'partner in crime' Angelo Biviano, retired from his role as Treasurer at the end of the 2021-2022 financial year. Angelo and I joined the Committee in 2015 and worked closely together implementing many new initiatives to develop the club's financial and administrative functions. Angelo has overseen a transformation of the club's financial processes including an upgrade to our accounting system, introduction of electronic banking, changing banks, arranging debt facilities to support the clubhouse rebuild, re-introducing budgeting processes and engaging an outsourced bookkeeping service provider, to name a few of the initiatives he has led. Angelo's impact on the club has been low-profile but significant. His presence on the Committee will be greatly missed.

As a result of Angelo's resignation, the Committee declared a casual vacancy and appointed Tony Martin to the vacant role of Treasurer, in line with the Club Rules. This gave Angelo the luxury of managing a smooth and complete handover to Tony, with whom we look forward to working over the coming years. The club is up to date with all its compliance requirements.

Our Member Protection Officers, Sue Traynor and Sam Paynter have continued to support our members with a range of questions and issues. Their wisdom and discretion are gratefully acknowledged.

I would like to acknowledge the ongoing generous support provided by Jeremy Smith as our honorary solicitor. His advice at critical times is highly valuable to the club.



#### LIFE SAVING DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Firstly, I would like to thank every active patroller for another fantastic and successful season at Portsea Back Beach. The 2021-22 patrolling season was filled with COVID-19, a brandnew patrol, a tonne of preventative actions, rescues, Team App, major first aids, and loads of fun!

Leading into the season, we were ready for the combination of high beach attendance and large surf, however with the rise in COVID-19 cases and many patrollers falling ill, the fate of the Portsea patrolling season was uncertain. Nevertheless, and in very typical Portsea fashion, Portsea SLSC was still able to fill every patrol all season and fulfil our patrolling requirements. Not every club in the state can say the same! I want to say a huge thank you to every active patroller for their flexibility and willingness to help at other patrols when numbers were down.

Portsea was not only able to fulfil our own patrol goals this season, but we also assisted other clubs on the Peninsula. One of these clubs was Rosebud LSC. Thank you to all the Portsea members who went to the Rosebud and kept another stretch of beach safe. It was certainly a different patrolling experience on the bay!

Due to COVID-19, the state Lifeguard service was also struggling big time. As the Chief Lifeguard of the Mornington Peninsula, I was at times unable to fill lifeguard shifts due to Lifeguards falling ill or being close contacts. I put the message out to some of Portsea's most experienced and reliable patrollers if anyone

would be willing and able to help the Lifeguard service. Sure enough, I had Dwight Harrison, Henry Kiss, Darren 'Spot' Kerr and Georgie Kerr raise their hands. They completed their mission (the lifeguard fitness test), had an interview with an LSV recruiter, and were handed their contracts all on the same day. LSV were extremely appreciative of the help these Portsea SLSC members provided to the service. On a personal note, I was so proud of our club and the people in it who were so willing to help me and contribute to the safety of the beach during their holidays.

Of course, there is no way I could do all this without some help. I am extremely grateful for the amazing leadership team that I was surrounded by this season. A big thank you to Griffin Mitchell for your help as Deputy Lifesaving Director. You are one of the most enthusiastic people I know, and your energy always encouraged me to continue solving the problems that arose. I would also like to thank the Patrol Captains, Patrol Vice Captains and Mentors from each patrol group. These Patrol Leaders accounted for 2,767 preventative actions, this essentially equates to 2,767 possible rescues or injuries that would have occurred if these patrols were not there.

I would also like to thank the Patrol Leadership group consisting of Chris Perrott, Stephanie Hunter, Sophie Courtney and Emile Stigter.

This year we had an amazing season of education programs, and I would like to start with a massive thank you to all our Chiefs, Instructors, Water Safety, Trainers and Assessors who were involved in education at Portsea this season and are essential in successfully running these

education programs, we are all so grateful for your considerable contributions!

We kicked off the season with another successful Part-time Bronze course, led by the amazing Henry Kiss and Josh Nilsen. The program saw 25 candidates successfully attain their Bronze Medallion award and we were lucky to be able to deliver a face-to-face program once again. Congrats to all candidates on obtaining their Bronze and thank you to Henry and Josh for running another great course!

Excitingly we were back with Silver Camp this year after not being able to run the program last year. Griffin Mitchell and Oscar Hunter did a great job of organising the camp, where we were able to offer the IRB crew award to 45 eager participants and a great start to everyone's season with a few days of fun in the surf!

It was amazing to be able to once again run a 'normal' Bronze Camp, with 65 candidates living in at the surf club. The camp ran smoothly thanks to our amazing Bronze Chiefs, Instructors and Water Safety, as well as a great group of candidates. We had some amazing weather for the camp and I think all participants enjoyed spending time at the beach with friends and obtaining their Bronze Medallion! A massive congrats and thank you to Andrew May and Alex Madden for their amazing leadership.

Next up was the SRC program where 75 participants gained their SRC award. Chiefs, Steph Mahon and Alex Croft did an incredible job of organising and managing

Finally, I am excited to announce we will be introducing a new program this June, our Platinum Camp which will be aimed at our Silver Camp graduates and teach a variety of new skills including aquatic search and rescue. #### PORTSEA CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE REPORT



In January 2022, United Energy increased their generous support of the Club and committed to a 5-year sponsorship arrangement, with an agreement that their support be used to benefit the Mornington Peninsula Community. The decision was made to create the Portsea SLSC Centre of Excellence (COE) to deliver these benefits and Life Member Henry Kiss was appointed to lead the COE.

The reasons that Portsea was the best club for the role came down to the following factors.

- I. Portsea is now the largest club in Victoria;
- 2. We have the capacity to run programs and administer paid casual staff.
- 3. The club is committed to having more of a leadership role in the State.
- 4. The program provides an opportunity for the club to grow club activities beyond the back beach.

#### Some key goals were established early on, which were to:

- A. Provide Surf Lifesaving Education and Experiences on the Mornington Peninsula.
- B. Become a Lifesaving Victoria Service Partner delivering LSV programs.
- C. Provide training and assistance to other Surf Lifesaving clubs on the Mornington Peninsula.
- D. Expand the scope of community engagement to include non-members of the club.
- E. Become potential partners with schools, clubs, businesses, and other community groups.

Partnering with Lifesaving Victoria Portsea, the COE delivered Beach Education Programs to over 200 primary school students from schools in Hastings, Tyabb and Tootgarook. The Beach Education program is essentially a Nipper program for schools aimed at students in grades 5 and 6. These programs ran at Dromana Bay LSC and Point Leo SLSC and employed staff from Sorrento, Gunnamatta, Point Leo and Portsea, making them a truly 'Peninsula' program rather than just a Portsea one.

These programs provided Lifeguards with employment outside of regular Guard season and also provided Work Experience for students at Frankston High School, who are on track to get paid positions this year.

Portsea has had a long-standing relationship with Frankston High School through the fantastic efforts of Rowan Cameron and James Cameron. This season the club was able to provide additional support and the students were able to stay at the surf club for the first time. This has really helped the students to feel a stronger bond and as a result attendance at patrols has been at an all-time high. A quick summary:

- 24 Students gained Lifesaving Qualifications at November BM/SRC Camp.
- 16 students successfully completed Advanced Resuscitation Techniques certificate and First Aid.
- 12 senior students signed up to deliver schools programs.
- 54 students signed up for camp this year, a mix of SRC, BM and IRBC:
- Frankston High have also booked the club for a VET camp later in the year (Vocational Education and Training).

As a result of United Energy's support, time and effort was also invested into fundraising for Public Defibrillators. A Go-Fund-Me initiative raised money from the Weeroona Bay Swimmers to install a Defibrillator at Le Capucin Café near the Portsea Pier. We were then successful in getting a Mornington Peninsula Council grant to install one at Point Nepean National Park (in the Rangers office). Two training devices have also been purchased and informal training in how to use the devices has been carried out at coffee time at the Pier, for the Sorrento Croquet Club (at Pt Nepean), and Parks Victoria Staff.

A donation from an anonymous benefactor will also mean that there will soon be a Public Defib installed outside the radio room at the Clubhouse.

Plans are in place for the future and the next year should see.

- Lifesaver for a Day, schools from Sorrento, Bittern, Tyabb and Hastings have booked in over 300 students for the beach education program this November/December.
- Working with Parks Victoria to promote Education Programs and Lifeguard Services to schools using the new campsite (open October).
- Negotiating with school and community groups on bunkroom rentals for camps.
- Possible initiatives with Headspace Rosebud for at-risk youth on the Peninsula.
- Supporting other Peninsula Lifesaving Clubs in their training with plans to replicate the Frankston High School Initiative.

#### **EQUIPMENT DIRECTOR'S REPORT**



The equipment portfolio operated smoothly over the 2021-2022 season. Operational, competition, training and event requirements were all met with a sufficient quantity and quality of gear. Minor damage occurred, mainly to boards, IRB motors and ancillary equipment including to pumps, mega phones and rescue tubes, but no major damage occurred to threaten our operational requirements.

Significant attempts were made to minimise the financial impact of maintaining and purchasing Portsea's large quantity of gear. \$5,000 was covered under an ATV warranty claim. \$15,000 was provided to purchase SLSA approved gear under the BSEF (Beach Safety Equipment Fund) grant, and \$30,000 in 2:1 matched funding was provided by the government under the VESEP (Voluntary Emergency Services Equipment Program). Additionally, all board and IRB repairs were completed by our members, with repair components provided at low cost by cooperative suppliers. This resulted in very reasonable equipment finance actuals.


Various minor but beneficial changes were made to equipment and the storage room. Ease-of-use upgrades were implemented on the patrol trailer, which minimise OH&S risks when loading/unloading heavy marquees, as well as improved flag/sign storage. A fantastic, large new sign was placed during the peak-season halfway down the ramp. A mini storage table near the roller-doors and board wash-down racks were also built. Finally, a workshop was installed in the back corner of the gear room, which has proved to be incredibly useful for ongoing repairs. Shout-out to the facilities sub-committee for their ongoing assistance.

IRB usage has improved across the club, with nearly 20 new IRB drivers trained in the last season and impressive results in the IRB competition. IRB motors have presented minimal hiccups, and drivers are becoming more mechanically knowledgeable.

Finally, a few major projects are planned over the coming months. Resurfacing the equipment room, re-arranging the storage racks, new boards, a new fuel cabinet and an air-compressor to dry IRB engines and inflate ATV tires. All other ideas welcome!

I would like to praise everyone for another fantastic year at Portsea. Thank you to everyone who has assisted me personally. I look forward to the turn of the new season!

Bellsy Mahon joined Mia in a composite team to add to the point score in the beach relay, swim team and Cameron relay, and Charlie Cornwell joined a composite team to take silver in the U15 Cameron relay.

Down in the boat arena Portsea's Open Women's Crew, Amanda Rukuwai, Em von Moger, Scarlett Blewett, Alex Hagan and Stephen Blewett (sweep) was hard rowing! Although missing out on the medals, the crew showed that they have great boat speed when racing head-to-head with their competitors. The luck of the surf went against the crew who were beaten in two of the heats by teams coming in on waves from behind. Although they won the 4th heat, the team ended up 4th overall.

Without a doubt the standout competitor at the Vic Titles was Gabe Cornwell who took home a swag of medals including gold in U17 ski and iron, bronze in U17 surf race and then in a massive final effort took bronze in the Open Men's Iron.

# MAJOR EVENTS Portsea Swim Classic



January 15, 2022
delivered us a
glorious day, and one
that once again enabled
us to showcase the
beautifully pristine
waters and other
spectacles that the
Pt Nepean National Park
delivers. This, along with
a fast-flowing current,

helped all the swimmers enjoy the various races over the 500m, 1,500m and 2,500m courses.

With the cloud of COVID-19, reinforced by the arrival of Omicron, the spectacle of the Swim Classic once again gave the swimmers the opportunity to have a break from the rigours of the world and to let the enjoyment of the day give their minds some much needed relief. We once again restricted the event numbers to approximately 2,500 competitors to maintain the strict safety measures required, and to ensure a safe and successful event could be delivered.

This year marked the Portsea Swim Classic's 36th continuous year of the open water swimming event being staged. This achievement, given the complexities experienced in 2021, and again this year with Omicron, cannot be over-emphasized. The lessons we had learnt, and the systems, processes and understanding that we had developed in 2021 came to the fore. Due to the unwavering dedication of our large group of dedicated volunteers, some of whom had only just recovered from the virus, we were able to effectively deliver the event again.

I cannot emphasize enough the dedication of the area heads of the PSC and those in the greater PSLSC community who worked so hard prior and, on the day, to enable the 2022 PSC to occur. People continue to comment on the professionalism and the way the day operates seamlessly. Unlike many other events that have independent management groups running them, the PSC is planned, and run, by PSLSC volunteers, which means that the PSLSC gains the maximum financial outcome from the day. This is something that we all should not lose sight of and should be extremely proud of.

The excitement and mental relief that the 2021 PSC was able to deliver, to those competing, was palpable. With many other swimming events again cancelling or moving to a virtual format, the swimmers, focus had once again moved to the 2022 PSC and the hope, and high expectation that we could once again deliver on the day.

To maximize the potential for us to successfully deliver the 2022 PSC, the PSC sub-committee drew on all the lessons that we had learnt from the 2021 event. This process ensured that the necessary contingency planning was in place, and we were able to go into the day with the confidence and tools to deliver the event in a COVID-safe way. The strategies that had seen us successfully stage the 2021 event

were once again implemented, but as with 2021, the realisation that the 2022 event may not proceed was always a real possibility.

It was another proud moment standing on the Quarantine oval, watching the PSLSC volunteers efficiently undertaking all the duties required and ensuring that when issues arose, they were quickly resolved, without fanfare or disruption to the event. I also had the great pleasure of watching one of our 70+ aged swimmers come across the line with his daughter this year after competing in the mixed class event. This was an inspiring and special moment, as only 12 months earlier he had had a lifethreatening medical event on the finish line, where he was revived by the PSLSC team and later under-went heart surgery. These moments are the things that epitomize what we do as lifesavers and the importance of what we learn. These events, and the money they raise, are so important to all lifesaving clubs, not just PSLSC, as they help ensure our training programs and other initiatives can be facilitated.

We cannot thank the sponsors of the event enough. Their commitment, and belief in what we could achieve, was critical in allowing us to move forward with the confidence required to effectively deliver the event.



#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2022

The financial report is for Portsea Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Portsea Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an Association incorporated in Victoria and operating pursuant to the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.

#### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of Preparation**

Portsea Surf Lifesaving Club Inc applies Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements as set out in AASB 1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012. The Association is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

#### **Accounting Policies**

#### a. Revenue

#### Revenue Recognition

Operating Grants, Donations, Sponsorships and Bequests

When the Association receives operating grant revenue, donations, sponsorships or bequests, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance to AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers.

When both these conditions are satisfied, the Association:

- · identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- · recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficient specific performance obligations, the Association:

- recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (for example AASB 9: Financial instruments, AASB 16: Leases, AASB 116: Property, plant and equipment and AASB 138: Intangible assets);
- recognises related amounts (being contributions by Members, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer, sponsor or funder); and
- recognises revenue immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount
  of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the Association recognises revenue in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

#### Contributed Assets

The Association receives assets from the government and other parties at nil or nominal consideration in order to further its objectives. These assets are recognised in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (for example AASB 9: *Financial instruments*, AASB 16: *Leases*, AASB 116: *Property, plant and equipment* and AASB 138: *Intangible assets*).

On initial recognition of an asset, the Association recognises related amounts (being contributed by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer).

The Association recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between initial carrying amounts of the asset and the related amount.

#### Income from sale of goods

The Association sells merchandising products, and food and beverages to Members. Revenue is recognised when control of the products has transferred to the customer. For such transactions, this is when the products are delivered to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

Interest Income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

#### b. Inventories

Inventories held for sale are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration, are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

#### c. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated, less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

In the event where the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than the recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to the estimated recoverable amount.

Plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost or for nominal cost are valued and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

#### Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised lease assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

#### Class of Fixed Asset Depreciation Rate

Buildings 2.5% Fixture & Fittings 14% Plant and Equipment 33%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income in the period which they arise. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation surplus relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

#### d. Financial Instruments

Initial Recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Association becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is the date that the Association commits itself to either the purchase or sale of the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted).

Financial instruments (except for trade receivables) are initially measured at fair value plus transaction costs, except where the instrument is classified "at fair value through profit or loss", in which case transaction costs are expensed to profit or loss immediately. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

Trade receivables are initially measured at the transaction price if the trade receivables do not contain a significant financing component or if the practical expedient was applied as specified in AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers.

Classification and subsequent measurement

Financial Liabilities

Financial liabilities are subsequently measured at:

- amortised cost; or
- fair value through profit or loss.

A financial liability is measured at fair value through profit or loss if the financial liability is:

- a contingent consideration of an acquirer in a business combination to which AASB 3 :Business Combinations applies;
- held for trading; or
- initially designated as at fair value through profit or loss.

All other financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a debt instrument and of allocating interest expense in profit or loss over the relevant period.

The effective interest rate is the internal rate of return of the financial asset or liability. That is, it is the rate that exactly discounts the estimated future cash flows through the expected life of the instrument to the net carrying amount at initial recognition.

A financial liability is held for trading if it is:

- incurred for the purpose of repurchasing or repaying in the near term;
- part of a portfolio where there is an actual pattern of short-term profit taking; or
- a derivative financial instrument (except for a derivative that is in a financial guarantee contract or a derivative that is in an effective hedging relationship).

Any gains or losses arising on changes in fair value are recognised in profit or loss to the extent that they are not part of a designated hedging relationship.

The change in fair value of the financial liability attributable to changes in the issuer's credit risk is taken to other comprehensive income and is not subsequently reclassified to profit or loss. Instead, it is transferred to retained earnings upon derecognition of the financial liability.

If taking the change in credit risk in other comprehensive income enlarges or creates an accounting mismatch, then these gains or losses should be taken to profit or loss rather than other comprehensive income.

A financial liability cannot be reclassified.

#### Financial assets

Financial assets are subsequently measured at:

- amortised cost;
- fair value through other comprehensive income; or
- fair value through profit or loss.

Measurement is on the basis of two primary criteria:

- the contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial asset; and
- the business model for managing the financial assets.

A financial asset that meets the following conditions is subsequently measured at amortised cost:

- the financial asset is managed solely to collect contractual cash flows; and
- the contractual terms within the financial asset give rise to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding on specified dates.

A financial asset that meets the following conditions is subsequently measured at fair value through other comprehensive income:

- the contractual terms within the financial asset give rise to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding on specified dates; and
- the business model for managing the financial asset comprises both contractual cash flows collection and the selling of the financial asset.

By default, all other financial assets that do not meet the measurement conditions of amortised cost and fair value through other comprehensive income are subsequently measured at fair value through profit or loss.

The Association initially designates a financial instrument as measured at fair value through profit or loss if:

- it eliminates or significantly reduces a measurement or recognition inconsistency (often referred to as an "accounting mismatch") that would otherwise arise from measuring assets or liabilities or recognising the gains and losses on them on different bases;
- it is in accordance with the documented risk management or investment strategy and information about the grouping is documented appropriately, so the performance of the financial liability that is part of a group of financial liabilities or financial assets can be managed and evaluated consistently on a fair value basis; and
- it is a hybrid contract that contains an embedded derivative that significantly modifies the cash flows otherwise required by the contract.

The initial designation of the financial instruments to measure at fair value through profit or loss is a one-time option on initial classification and is irrevocable until the financial asset is derecognised.

#### Derecognition

Derecognition refers to the removal of a previously recognised financial asset or financial liability from the statement of financial position.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

A liability is derecognised when it is extinguished (i.e. when the obligation in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires). An exchange of an existing financial liability for a new one with substantially modified terms, or a substantial modification to the terms of a financial liability, is treated as an extinguishment of the existing liability and recognition of a new financial liability.

The difference between the carrying amount of the financial liability derecognised and the consideration paid and payable, including any non-cash assets transferred or liabilities assumed, is recognised in profit or loss.

Derecognition of financial assets

A financial asset is derecognised when the holder's contractual rights to its cash flows expires, or the asset is transferred in such a way that all the risks and rewards of ownership are substantially transferred.

All the following criteria need to be satisfied for the derecognition of a financial asset:

- the right to receive cash flows from the asset has expired or been transferred;
- all risk and rewards of ownership of the asset have been substantially transferred; and
- the Association no longer controls the asset (i.e. it has no practical ability to make unilateral decisions to sell the asset to a third party).

On derecognition of a financial asset measured at amortised cost, the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the sum of the consideration received and receivable is recognised in profit or loss.

On derecognition of a debt instrument classified as fair value through other comprehensive income, the cumulative gain or loss previously accumulated in the investment revaluation reserve is reclassified to profit or loss.

On derecognition of an investment in equity which the Association elected to classify under fair value through other comprehensive income, the cumulative gain or loss previously accumulated in the investments revaluation reserve is not reclassified to profit or loss, but is transferred to retained earnings.

#### Impairment

The Association recognises a loss allowance for expected credit losses on:

- financial assets that are measured at amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income;
- lease receivables;
- contract assets (e.g. amount due from customers under construction contracts);
- loan commitments that are not measured at fair value through profit or loss; and
- financial guarantee contracts that are not measured at fair value through profit or loss.

Loss allowance is not recognised for:

- financial assets measured at fair value through profit or loss; or
- equity instruments measured at fair value through other comprehensive income.

Expected credit losses are the probability-weighted estimate of credit losses over the expected life of a financial instrument. A credit loss is the difference between all contractual cash flows that are due and all cash flows expected to be received, all discounted at the original effective interest rate of the financial instrument.

The Association uses the following approaches to impairment, as applicable under AASB 9 : Financial Instruments :

the simplified approach;

#### Simplified approach

The simplified approach does not require tracking of changes in credit risk at every reporting period, but instead requires the recognition of lifetime expected credit loss at all times.

This approach is applicable to:

- trade receivables or contract assets that result from transactions that are within the scope of AASB 15:
   Revenue from Contracts with Customers, and which do not contain a significant financing component;
   and
- lease receivables.

In measuring the expected credit loss, a provision matrix for trade receivables is used taking into consideration various data to get to an expected credit loss (i.e. diversity of its customer base, appropriate groupings of its historical loss experience, etc).

For the year ended 30 June 2022 the Committee estimate the loss rate to be zero, therefore no expected credit loss allowance was recognised.

#### e. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Association reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the statement of comprehensive income.

Where the assets are not held primarily for their ability to generate cash inflows – that is, they are specialised assets held for continuing use of their service capacity – the recoverable amounts are expected to be materially the same as fair value.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an assets class, the Association estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the class of assets belong.

Where an impairment loss on a revalued individual asset is identified, this is recognised against the revaluation surplus in respect of the same class of asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same class of asset.

#### f. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

#### g. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cashflow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

#### h. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Association a Public Benevolent Institution and is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act* 1997.

#### i. Employee Benefits

#### Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and sick leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

The Association's obligations for short-term employee benefits such as wages and salaries are recognised as part of trade and other payables in the statement of financial position. Contributions are made by the Association to an employee's superannuation fund and are charged as expenditure when incurred.

#### i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from sponsors, outstanding grant receipts and other miscellaneous debtors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Trade receivables are initially recognised at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any provision for impairment. Refer to Note 1 (d) for further discussion on the determination of impairment losses.

#### k. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the Association that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amount normally paid within 30 days of the recognition of the liability. Trade and other payables are initially measured at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

#### I. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at reporting date.

#### m. Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

#### n. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The Committee evaluate estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.

#### **Key Estimates**

#### (i) Impairment

The Association assesses impairment at each reporting date by evaluation of conditions and events specific to the Association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

#### (ii) Useful lives of property, plant and equipment

As described in Note 1(c), the Association reviews the estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment at the end of each annual reporting period.

#### **Key Judgements**

(i) Property Lease

The Association only has a lease of clubhouse land which is considered a peppercorn lease (lease significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the Association to further its objectives) and the Association has not elected to measure this lease at fair value, the lease cost is considered a low-value lease and as such the Association has elected not to apply AASB 16: Leases to this lease.

(ii) Performance obligations under AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers

To identify a performance obligation under AASB 15, the promise must be sufficiently specific to be able to determine when the obligation is satisfied. The Committee exercises judgement to determine whether the promise is sufficiently specific by taking into account any conditions specified in the arrangement, explicit or implicit, regarding the promised goods or services. In making this assessment, Committee includes the nature/type, cost/value, quantity, and the period of transfer related to the goods or services promised.

#### (iii) Employee benefits

For the purpose of measurement, AASB 119: *Employee Benefits* defines obligations for short-term employee benefits as obligations expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service. The Committee believe that obligations for part of annual leave entitlements satisfy the definition of short-term employee benefits and are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

#### o. New and Amended Accounting Policies Adopted by the Association

The Association has adopted all of the new and revised Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations applicable to its operations which became mandatory.

The adoption of these Standards has not had a significant impact on the financial statements of the Association.

#### New Accounting Standards for Application in Future Periods

The Association has not yet assessed or adopted the new simplified disclosure standard AASB 1060: General Purpose Financial Statements- Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities which replaces the existing Reduced Disclosure Reporting framework. This new standard will become mandatory for the financial years starting 1 July 2022.

Other related parties include close family members of Key Management Personnel and entities that are controlled or jointly controlled by those Key Management Personnel individually or collectively with their close family members.

For the 2022 and the 2021 financial year there were family members of various Key Management Personnel (amongst others) working in the food & beverage and/or administration area at the club on a casual basis throughout summer at commercial market rates, in addition to services and/or product provided to the value of under \$2,500 to a family member of a member of Key Management Personnel.
