



#### PRESIDENT'S FOREWORD



It is with great pleasure that I report on the 75th season of operation for the Portsea Surf Life Saving Club. It has again been a privilege to lead a wonderful group of members and staff who allow us to do all that we do, and I am incredibly

proud of what has been achieved.

This season we celebrated our 75th anniversary, which provided a great opportunity to reflect on where we have come from, where we are today and importantly, where we are going. We are a very different club to that founded by Mil Napthine and friends in 1949, and many, many people have contributed to that journey.

Today we are the largest surf lifesaving club in Australia, with just under 6,000 members (2019: 2,000 members). We have now had five seasons in our new clubhouse, which has been a game changer for the club.

In season 2023/24 almost 500 Portsea volunteers patrolled our beaches for more than 10,000 hours.

One of the highlights of the season was the establishment of a patrol at Quarantine Station (Point Nepean), operating on weekends from Boxing Day until Australia Day. This new patrol area was seen as a success, and we are planning to patrol there again in 2024/25. A special thanks to Henry Kiss for his work in establishing this patrol, and to all who supported it.

In total, there were 17 rescues, 2 major first aids (requiring ambulances) and 2,968 preventative actions. In 75 years, no lives have been lost on a patrolled beach at Portsea.

Our education programs also had a great impact. We educated almost 1,000 members from Nippers (665 Nippers) through to five of our members who attained the Gold Medallion. We also had almost 20 members take part in formal leadership development programs offered by Life Saving Victoria or Surf Life Saving Australia.

We have also expanded our community education program, which has seen significant investment from the Club in recent years, supported by our education partner United Energy. Again the Frankston High School partnership continued, with 59 students gaining their Bronze or SRC via our program. We also ran programs in five schools from Sorrento, Balnarring, Dromana and Hastings, delivering water safety education and skills to over 600 students, many being their first time to the beach.

A new program was the addition of a Snippers program (Senior Nippers) providing basic lifesaving skills to grandparent aged members.

Our competition team also had a great year across juniors, Open/Youth, Masters and IRB racing. Our Masters team finished third on the points score at the Victorian State Titles, possibly our best ever, and also performed well at the Australian Titles. Well done to Sue Crow bringing home a Gold (surf race) and Bronze (2k swim), and to Rob Mellor, who claimed a Bronze in the Masters Surf Board Riding, our first medal in that event. Our Open/Youth team also performed well, headlined by Mackie Hunter who won Gold in the U19 2k swim. Mackie is the first Victorian to win a swim race at Aussies since 1996.

Our use of our clubhouse is also expanding and now year-round. We offer a member service (food and beverage) every week of the year and are offering the venue for private functions when not in use for lifesaving purposes. It is proving very popular for a wide range of functions from weddings to funerals, to corporate days and a wide range of functions, which provides important revenue to fund our operation.

Our major events, the Portsea Swim Classic, the Bay to Surf walk/run, the Pier to Perignon Swim and the Portsea All Stars Golf Day continue to grow and are important fundraising opportunities for the club. Thanks to all who contributed to their success. Tragically, one of our regular swimmers Simon Weatherill died during the Portsea Swim Classic. We remember him fondly and extend our condolences to his family and friends.

Away from the beach the Club is in good shape and is debt free. We have a united Committee who work hard year-round for the betterment of the Club. I thank them all for their contribution. I'd particularly like to single out Club Captain Jacqui Hart, who leaves us as she pursues the next stage of her career overseas. We wish her well.

I'd also like to thank Rob Fildes for his ongoing support as Patron, and all members who have served on of the many subcommittees of the Club. Finally, I'd like to thank our staff who work so hard to support the Club, under the leadership of our General Manager Rod Leonard.

#### **CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT**



This year marked our 75th season, it has truly been a remarkable one! As a team, we achieved some incredible milestones both on and off the beach. We have had a highly successful season in regard to life saving as

we continue to have 'no lives lost' between our flags since 1949. This is all thanks to our active members who volunteered a massive 6,900 patrol hours and 2,200 of water safety hours.

Before I run through the amazing achievements of this season I would like to say a massive thank you to all of the members of the Operational Committee for their hard work and the countless hours of volunteering. The 2023/24 Operational Committee members included Sas McNamara (Life Saving Director), Jack White (Education Director), Andrew May (Co-Equipment Director), Finn Nicholas (Co-Equipment Director), Oscar Hunter (Events Director), Sophie Courtney (Co-Member Engagement Director), Steph Mahon (Co-Member Engagement Director), Nik Rathmayr (Accommodation Director) and Flynn Chable (First Aid Director).

This season saw 17 major rescues and nearly 3,000 preventative actions across both Portsea Back Beach and the Quarantine Station as we launched our new bayside patrol. These numbers are indicative of the incredible response we saw from our members in the face of a huge surge of fatal and non-fatal drownings across Victorian beaches in recent years. The hours volunteered by our active members and the leadership of our Patrol Captains and Vice Captains have been instrumental in ensuring the safety of Portsea beachgoers.

Our education team also went above and beyond this season. The demand for our education programs in recent years has been unprecedented and our education team has worked tirelessly to provide essential surf awareness and skills training. We reached a record number of participants this summer, including 665 Nippers, 8 Starfish Nippers, and hundreds more through our Platinum, Silver, Bronze, Cadet, SRC, and advanced training programs. Thank you to all our Program Directors, subcommittee members, camp chiefs, trainers, and assessors for making this possible.

We also reached a record number of participants across all our fundraising events. Thank you to every member who volunteered their time at the Swim Classic, Bay to Surf and Pier to Perignon. These events generate vital funds for our lifesaving operations, with over 4,000 competitors across the events. These events would not be possible without the support of our volunteers, and it is always great to see a combination of active and associate members supporting the club!

As usual, in the competition arena, our competitors have been hard at work, representing the Club at state and national events. I'd like to congratulate all our summer competition team members and IRB team members on their accomplishments this season.

Away from the water, our social calendar was jampacked, offering our full suite of club social events including president's clubs, Nipper Cocktail Party, and various social events on the deck. A key event of this season was our 75th Anniversary celebration which was a fantastic night celebrating 75 proud years of lifesaving at Portsea. We had 350 members who gathered to celebrate our past, present and future.

A special thanks to Julian Byrne, Tim Hart, Sue Traynor, Cam Hunter, Charlotte Mahon and Nick Flockart for sharing memories of what Portsea SLSC means to them. Congratulations to the events team, who do a lot of work behind the scenes to make these events possible.

With the season coming to a close, I will be stepping down from the Club Captain role as I head to London for the next few years to pursue my career. I am deeply appreciative of the opportunities I have been afforded as Club Captain, Education Director, a Committee Member and an Active Member to collaborate with and learn from members of our vibrant and knowledgeable community. The guidance and opportunities I've received have been invaluable and I am excited for others to share the incredible experience I have had!

This year the recipient of the Club Captain Award was Sas McNamara who has been an amazing support to me over the past few seasons and has made a huge contribution to the club as Life Saving director. I am also happy to leave you in her capable hands as the new Club Captain elect and I am very excited to see Sas make her mark in this new role.

A final thanks to all the wonderful mentors and supporters I've had in this club over the years in various roles. We are so fortunate to have such an amazing group of members and I truly love being a leader and member of the Portsea Surf Life Saving Club. Can't wait to see you all on the beach or deck for an Aperol soon!

#### **GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT**



With my first full season under my belt through the summer of 2022/23 I was excited to get into the season of 2023/24 with prior knowledge, learnings and experiences. The aim was to deliver a higher quality of member services at the Portsea SLSC.

Coming out of Easter 2023, was like I had been swept up in a tornado and

spat out the other side after commencing in September 2022. a whirlwind six months. It was a baptism of fire and similar to drinking out of a fire hydrant! However, we got through that first season and were ready to assess, analyse and make changes coming into summer 2023/24.

We spent the winter looking at what worked, what didn't work, how we operate, what we offer our members and what more we could offer. A lot of this feedback came from a member survey, which was conducted in April 2023. This provided some fantastic comments, suggestions and data for us to analyse to work towards providing our members the services they were requesting.

A key area of feedback was the request from our members to have the club operating longer hours through the non, peak period. This would allow members to stay engaged with the club and with other members.

Through this feedback the Portsea SLSC, for the first time, provided a member off-season experience. Between Easter and November 2023, the club offered the following.

- Traded every Friday night through the year,. Ran the Portsea SLSC Winter Festival. Trivia Night, Christmas in July, Rock night.
- Multiple member private functions, 50ths, engagement parties, weddings. School camps.

All these events were well attended and well received and have set the platform for similar offerings in the coming years.

Our off season also saw us refine the way that we provide services to our member base. We looked at bettering the food and beverage services at the club by changing our menu selections and our service options, providing more food choices through our high volume days including mobile food van and Nipper Day BBQ's. We also appointed shift managers through our peak period to provide a more consistent member experience. All areas assisted in providing a more consistent service throughout the summer and shoulder periods.

Leading into our peak season again I was grateful to work with our Education Manager Henry Kiss plus our volunteer education personnel in Jack White, Jacqui Hart, Steph Mahon and their team of leaders. With their help we conducted both Silver and Bronze Camps at the club.

It was a great experience to witness in essence the main purpose of this club, Education and Life Saving and seeing these dedicated volunteers apply their skills and knowledge to well over 100 new lifesavers in the making.

The summer was again another very busy time at Portsea SLSC with Nippers, Swim Classic, Bay to Surf Run, Pier to Perignon, Nipper Parents Cocktail Party, President's Club events and many more.

Throughout the year we ran in excess of fifty events!! This cannot be done without the support of volunteers and staff.

The highlight of the summer was the 75th Anniversary cocktail party held at the club on the 25th of January. Well over 350 attendees celebrated 75 wonderful years of keeping the Portsea back beach safe. Words from Matt Mahon, Tim Hart, Julian Byrne, Cameron Hunter, Nick Flockhart and others really set the scene and provided the rich history of the club. Rocking the night away with tunes from our resident club DJ Griff Mitchell, it truly was a fantastic celebration of our wonderful club.

As we came through summer and finished up with a very busy shoulder period, I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff who work tirelessly in providing you, our members, a wonderful service and experience throughout the year.

I would like to thank in particular the efforts of Sally Meaden (Food and Beverage Manager) Amanda Dyer (Administration Manager) Patrick Leprevost, Elliot Nicol and Sam Pritchard (Duty Managers) for your leadership, support and efforts throughout the year.

As this season is coming to a close and we are in the throes of planning for the upcoming season, I have spent some time reflecting back on what has been another jam-packed schedule at the Portsea SLSC. There were many positives but also many areas of improvement, both with my own development as General Manager and also within our club processes. These will be a focus leading into season 2024/25.

My goal is to continually build and grow our team and provide them the support they need, to in turn, provide you our members with the best service possible, be it from a social, educational or voluntary capacity. We may not get it right all the time, but we will continue to keep working towards improving and growing.

I feel we have a strong base to work from and the feedback provided from our members will lay a foundation for our planning moving forward in 2024/25 and beyond.

#### LIFE SAVING DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Once again Portsea SLSC patrollers had a very successful season between the flags. I would like to thank every single one of our patrollers for their commitment this season to ensuring that every beach goer has a safe

and fun time at our favourite beach.

At the start of the season, the Patrol Captains, Vice Captains and Mentors came together for the very first patrol of the season. This has become a tradition for the past few seasons, and allows the leaders of our patrols to ensure they are up to scratch with their knowledge, dust off the patrolling cobwebs, and equal their awards to ensure proficiency. The Patrol Leaders are the backbone of our patrols and we are all extremely thankful for their commitment and passion to the service. I would like to extend a huge thank you to Charlie Flockart for his help as Deputy Lifesaving Director.

The season was an unusually short one, starting on the 25th November 2023 and finishing on the 14th April 2024. Nevertheless, Portsea patrollers still contributed a tremendous amount of effort. Our patrollers volunteered 6,900 hours of patrol and 2,200 hours of water safety and other service. Our patrollers took 2,842 preventative actions which avoided potential drownings or first aid to our beach goers and other members, attended eight minor first aids, one major first aid, and rescued seventeen people out of danger.

This season we added two new patrols to the mix, Endless Summer and Mavericks. Well done to the Patrol leaders of these two new patrols for taking on the daunting yet exciting task of setting up a brand new patrol! We also added a brand-new site and patrol to our service at Portsea. Led by none other than Henry Kiss, this new patrol was located at Quarantine Station. The Quarantine patrol set up on the beach adjacent to the Jarman Oval where we host our beloved Swim Classic event.

Patrolling is the key reason why Portsea SLSC exists and I couldn't be prouder of the calibre of patrollers coming through our education programs today. I look forward to another very successful season of patrols at Portsea for the 2024/2025 season!

sand, in the pool, or in
the ocean, in a boat, on a
board, a ski, towing a

patient in a tube or rescuing one in an IRB, lends itself to the upskilling of members to be fit and rescue ready.

This year we had fantastic group of about 40 Junior Competition Team members, from U8, U13 develop their surf sports skills by joining our regular summer competition training events. The surf sports squad is open to all Nippers and information can be found on the Club website here: https://portseasurf.com.au/junior-comp/

Summer competition training included supervised open water Pier to Point swimming sessions at the Portsea pier, specialised board paddling training and regular beach and water event training at Quarantine. Our squad members were coached by Tom Regan, one of Portsea's foundation coaches and experienced surf sports competitors.

Tom did an amazing job passing on his skills and knowledge to our junior athletes. Thanks also to John Vains for his board paddling expertise and Logan Brandi for his open water swimming tips and Harvey Larke for his coaching support. A highlight for me as Junior Team Manager was seeing our newest squad members advancing their skills, making new comp team friends, creating bonds with older Nippers and becoming more confident in their abilities in the water.

We train to compete at junior surf lifesaving carnivals. The junior squad had a team of 25 Nippers attend the Mount Martha carnival (28 January) and the Point Leo carnival (4 February). This is where our Portsea Nippers can compete against junior competitors from Clubs around the State. A big congratulations to all the new squad members who competed for Portsea for the first time.

The season culminated with the Victorian Junior State Championships at Warrnambool SLSC over the March long weekend. The event brought together 700 of the best Nipper athletes from across Victoria. Our junior team represented the, Red & White, of Portsea with great endeavour, enthusiasm and pride.

They have all developed into confident, skilled young athletes. They are our future patrolling members at Portsea and I know our beach will be safe in their hands.

The senior competition calendar started with the Endurance Championships at Torquay. This is an opportunity for our older Junior Competition Team members to come along and race with the older age groups, right through to Masters. Zara Barr and Sophie Hall were outstanding junior competitors, Logan Brandi, Sophie Jacka, Mia Horskins and Charlie Cornwell dominated the U17 races, with Sue Crow, Alice Miliani, Chloe Cornwell and Phil Harford following up with star performances in the Masters races.

Onto the summer carnivals we had our stalwart competitors, in particular Charlie and Gabe Cornwell who have made lifesaving their sport of choice. Supported by mum and dad, Chloe and James, who are the first to volunteer for official duties, the brothers dominated the season with a multitude of successes across the ski races in particular, in addition to irons, swims and board races.

We had Victorian State Team representation by Charlie, who ventured north to Sydney to race in the interstate races, plus Xavier Purcell and Harvey Larke who competed in the Wieland Shield team against the touring Californian lifeguards.

Victorian Championships saw a strong turnout of water competitors, in particular our swimmers, who won GOLD in the U17, U19 and Open Men's Surf Teams events, and two GOLD and a BRONZE in the corresponding women's events. Bellsy Mahon showed her strength with a GOLD in the U17 Tube Race, and once again we had Charlie and Gabe Cornwell racing circuits of the ocean course for multiple medals, pairing up for GOLD in the U19 Double Ski, and each of them taking GOLD in their respective Iron Races.

The Aussies Championships saw one of our larger team in recent years. Our U19 men showed their prowess in the water events with Harvey Larke and Xavier Purcell finalists in their U19 Surf Race, Harvey also making the Open Surf Race final. They then paired up with Charlie and Gabe Cornwell to place 5th in the U19 Surf Teams race. Charlie and Gabe paddled through multiple ski rounds to make their ski finals. Our Aussies women fielded teams across multiple events from U17 through to open, both in the ocean and down at the beach track, joining mixed relays with our U19 rowers-come-beachies. Mia Horskins shone with her first ever AUSSIES finals appearance in the U17 Surf Race. Bellsy and Cha Mahon, Domi Hart, Sophie Jacka and Ruby Wilson raced rounds of irons, taplins and surf teams races. Down at Alex Headlands, our open women's surf boat crew were light on race practice but ventured north to represent Portsea at yet another AUSSIES.

Mackenzie Hunter was a dominant force on the Victorian Open Water Swim circuit, winning the Portsea Swim Classic Junior 1.2km swim and the Open 2.5km swims, plus for the second year in a row, won the Lorne Pier to Pub Junior swim, then placed second to world champ and Olympian Lani Pallister in the Open Superfish. Mack left the Australian pool championships where she won the 17yo girls 800m freestyle event, to venture north to Mooloolaba for the SLSA AUSSIES. Her reward was a GOLD medal in the U19 2km Open Water Swim, making Mackie the only Victorian athlete to win an individual gold at the AUSSIES U17, Open Championships. She became the first Victorian female in their 40-year history of inclusion at Aussies to win an individual GOLD in a swimming event. Sophie Jacka earned club points with a 5th in the U17 2km swim, with Mia Horskins, Logan Brandi and Charlie Cornwell also going the distance around the open water course.

In addition to their surf race performances at the LSV Victorian Championships, Bella Murchie and Campbell Wilson-Moran had stellar results in the pool

lifesaving events. At the 2023 SLSA Pool Rescue Champs Bella competed with Mordialloc and as a reasonably novice competitor, she showed her prowess, completing her events without a DQ, winning medals in both relay and individual events, including a relay Australian record. Campbell Wilson-Moran also competed at the SLSA 2023 Pool Rescue Champs winning multiple medals in the relay events. In January 2024, competing for Portsea in the Victorian State Team at the RLSS Australian Pool Lifesaving Champs in Melbourne, Bella Murchie won six medals, including GOLD in the U16 100m manikin carry.

The enthusiasm of the Portsea Masters team has had an injection of 30 year old youth with the captaincy baton securely passed to Jim Unkles and Nick Tissot, who recruited new additions Bec Gould and Michael Benson to bolster our medals in the 30-34 age group. Our strong turnout at the Lorne Masters Champs, saw us place 3rd in the Ocean events and 4th in the Beach events. Next up was Aussies Masters, where the focus is definitely on staying fit, camaraderie and mateship with medals a rewarding bonus. Sue Crow was our standout performer with GOLD in the Surf Race and BRONZE in the 2km Ocean Swim. Rob Mellor, a late entry to the Masters Surfing Competition revelled in the beach break conditions at Coolum to win our first ever surfing medal, a BRONZE in his longboard division.

As we wrap up the 2023/24 season, we have Bella heading off to her second SLSA Pool Rescue Aussies, our swimmers grinding out the k's in the pool, our paddlers back in their kayaks, our Masters nursing injuries back to health and our juniors heading to Queensland for a September holiday training camp. Well done to all who participated to the spirit of our competition team and welcome to any new members who want to join in the fun of representing Portsea on the sporting arena.

#### **EDUCATION DIRECTOR'S REPORT**



2023/24 saw another massive season of education down at Portsea, across all areas of our training and assessment programs. From camps to requals, it was fantastic to see members of all ages embrace their training

with such enthusiasm during the summer whilst learning the vital skills required to patrol our challenging aquatic environment.

This season, the Education Team delivered over 437 new awards (some of the highest numbers in the State). Obviously, this could not have been achieved without our amazing Instructors - we cannot thank you enough for your support and greatly appreciate all your help!

Starting off the education year, Platinum Camp was another huge success and saw fourteen candidates obtain their Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue (SMAR) award. Adding to the knowledge delivered on Silver Camp, it was great to see our young leaders broaden their skill sets for use on patrols/emergency incidents while engaging with lifesaving at an advanced level. In only its second year, Platinum is quickly cementing itself in Portsea's education pathway; we can't wait to see many more candidates complete the program in the years to come.

Following on in September, Silver Camp was another highlight on the education calendar, upskilling members who completed Bronze Camp the previous season. Expertly lead by Chief Instructors Griffin Mitchell and Sophie Courtney - and assisted by IRB Instructor Finn Nicholas - Silver was a massive hit for the 31 candidates who braved the 'fresh' Portsea conditions to gain their Inflatable Rescue Boat Crew (IRBC) and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques and First Aid (ART/FA) awards.

In October, our increasingly popular Part-Time Bronze program commenced, delivering the fundamentals of lifesaving to members (beyond the age of Bronze Camp) wanting to get involved with / make a return to active patrolling. With the program delivered by Henry Kiss, it was fantastic to see 25 new Bronzies enjoy their regular weeknight sessions and practical training during their journey to become qualified surf lifesavers.

Like usual, Bronze Camp did not disappoint in early December, with another keen cohort of 65 Bronzies tackling the demanding yet rewarding program. Steph Mahon and Manna Johnson did an incredible job facilitating the week-long, live-in camp that continues to create some of the best lifesavers in Victoria. Congratulations to everyone who completed Bronze this year, we look forward to seeing you in Red and Yellow for many seasons to come!

Consecutively, requalification sessions were delivered throughout November and December. Albeit slightly different compared to previous years, requals were well received as the Club continued navigating the changes presented by the post-pandemic environment. With instructors grouping requals based on awards, scheduling multiple requal sessions on the same days and delivering the majority of Bronze requals at Quarantine, we were able to achieve a more efficient and better standard of requals in 2023/24.

In late December, Cadet Camp was another resounding success whilst reinforcing the key lifesaving skills candidates acquired the previous year. Under the leadership of Charlie Dowling, Emie Young and Charlie Paynter, another 70 cadets successfully completed camp at the back beach in a new and updated program format. We look forward to seeing many cadets on Bronze camp this December!

At the start of the New Year, our SRC camps took place (the largest of our programs). With 112 SRC's being introduced to the essentials of surf lifesaving across two camps, it was amazing to see so many young members enjoy learning the basic rescue techniques and looking forward to joining patrols. A massive congratulations to Nick Flockart and Mackie Hunter (Camp I) and Tom Scalzo & Charlotte Mahon (Camp 2) for their work as Chief Instructors and contributing to each camp's overwhelming success.

Once again, as training is the foundation of everything in lifesaving. I would like to thank everyone involved in education for their invaluable work in making all of our programs possible. From instructing, providing water safety and organising admin in the background, nothing goes unnoticed. However, I would especially like to thank Glennis Winnett (Education Support Officer), Claire Whitbread (Education Support Officer) and Stephanie Hunter (Deputy Education Director) for their major contributions this season, it simply would not have been possible without them!

Finally, thank you to everyone who has made 23/24 such an enjoyable season across all areas of the club. With many exciting developments on the horizon for the upcoming summer, I can't wait to see you all back at Portsea in 2024/2025. Catch you on the beach!

#### Portsea Starfish Nipper Program

Portsea Surf Life Saving Club ran its successful Starfish Nipper program for the third year over the 2023/24 season. The Starfish Nipper program is a modified Nipper program for children and young adults with a disability including autism, attention deficit disorder, Down's syndrome, Asperger's Syndrome, physical and intellectual disabilities, learning difficulties and psychological issues such as anxiety. As with the mainstream Nipper program the goals are to increase beach safety awareness, improve water safety skills, increase physical fitness and co-ordination, and provide positive social interactions.

The Starfish program is run on the same dates and times as our larger Nippers program and many families have children in both programs. A number of parents said that their children loved being able to wear the Nipper gear and go off to Nippers for the morning, just like their siblings and friends. The Starfish sessions are held on the beach and in the water at Point Nepean front beach and for two sessions we were lucky enough to be visited by dolphins!

This year's Starfish program grew to include eight participants ranging from 6 to 14 years of age. It was very pleasing to see some new faces as well as those returning after enjoying the previous year's program. It is wonderful to see not only the joy on the faces of our Starfish Nippers but also on those of their parents, siblings and grandparents who can come along to support and watch.

The program was led by Alex Madden and Molly Tozer, along with many enthusiastic helpers, including those with specialised skills and experiences working with people with a disability. As a result of the amazing support provided by these members of the Club, we are able to offer a 2:1 ratio of helpers to Starfish.

We believe everyone deserves access to Nippers and are keen to continue to grow the number of participants this coming summer. #### CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE REPORT



It was a fantastic season of activities for the Portsea Centre of Excellence (CoE) for 2023/24.

#### Frankston High School Program

The Frankston High School Bronze/SRC camp grew to capacity, fifty-nine candidates either completed a new award or requalified their current Lifesaving Certificate, with eight students going on to complete their

IRBC award over the summer.

Forty-six students received First Aid certification and another sixty-eight received CPR certificates. Patrol hours were up for this cohort and it was fantastic to see twenty-four students arrive to paddle boards as water safety for the P2P. This year's camp will again be at capacity. With so many students signed up the year 7's will be attending as day-campers only.

The Frankston High students also ran Water Safety and activities for Sorrento Primary Schools 'Iron Kid' event.

#### Schools Program

The Portsea CoE ran a number of LSV endorsed Beach Education programs for schools on the Mornington Peninsula. Students from Balnarring Primary School, St Joseph's Hastings, St Mary's Tyabb, Sorrento Primary and St Joseph's Sorrento participated in events at Balnarring, Sorrento Beach, Pt Leo and Blairgowrie Marina. In all, approximately 350 students were involved in the programs and a dozen Portsea/Sorrento members employed as casual instructors. Portsea also supplied Water Safety staff for programs run by Moorooduc Primary at Mornington and Dromana Primary at Dromana.

#### School Camps

The second Snippers Program happened in January! 'Snippers' (Seniors Nippers) aimed at Nipper Grandparents who might be left looking after the kids when the parents go back to work. Run over three sessions covered water safety (waves and rips), CPR and Defibs and then a wet activity of rescues with everyday items. The eight candidates all gave very positive feedback. The program will return for January 2025!

Public Defibs, Three Defibrillators are installed and ready for use at Le Capucin (Caf $\sqrt{\odot}$  at Portsea Pier), Pt Nepean Campground (next to the camp kitchen) and outside the radio room of our Portsea Backbeach clubhouse.

Personal Defibs. Portsea has now entered a relationship with CellAED, a percentage of the sale of each personal defib will come back to the club..

#### Mornington Peninsula Aquatic Action Working Group

Portsea has been invited to contribute to this group which includes representatives from the Shire, other Emergency Services (SES,AV, Police, FRV) and the Back Beach Collective, to develop tools and resources to help prevent drownings on the Peninsula. These resources will be made available through the Portsea Social media channels in the near future.

## **EQUIPMENT DIRECTOR'S REPORT**



Over the last 12 months, our Club's equipment has supported a great number of programs and events. In addition to our extensive education programs, major events, competition teams and lifesaving services, we have also loaned equipment to other Peninsula clubs for their community events and to Life Saving Victoria for emergency callouts and local search and

rescue operations. It is a fantastic privilege to have a sizeable portfolio of serviceable and well-maintained equipment to support fellow clubs and the wider community in their times of need.

I had the privilege of supporting the equipment portfolio from afar for a significant portion of the season. In my absence, Blair Nuske and Finn Nicholas, as Deputy Equipment Directors, steadfastly maintained the equipment portfolio. They facilitated the IRB components of Silver Camp in September, passed gear inspections, supported various education and community programs, and performed the incessant repairs and maintenance of equipment required to keep our lifesaving services operational throughout the main season. I would like to thank them both enormously for their contributions and performances!

In the off-season, we endeavoured to continue maximising storage space in the equipment room. Firstly, we rearranged storage racks and transferred less-utilised equipment to off-site storage at Quarantine. Secondly, we wanted to tackle the larger issue of relocating the bins inside the equipment room to the outside bin storage. We developed an action plan with the facilities subcommittee (FSC) to expand the footprint of the bin storage area to fit all the bins, pallets and crates from the equipment room. The work was completed smoothly before the season commenced, and I would like to thank Martin Tissot and the FSC for their support!

The reveal of three new IRBs at the Wall of Fame function was an exciting evening for the equipment portfolio. Due to production delays post-pandemic, Portsea has not welcomed a new IRB since the 'Jesse Faulkhead' IRB unveiling five years ago. The three new IRBs were named after three outstanding volunteers and worthy recipients. Jim Unkles, Bec Gould, and Nick Tissot. Following the christening of the boats, they have become integral to the Portsea IRB Racing Team, as new strict competition rules only permit us to race these 'generation Ill' boats. It's been great to see them used at many carnivals throughout the winter!

Next season, we have ambitions to continue improving the availability and storage of gear in the equipment room. We plan to provide 1-2 club surf skis for competition members to practice at the back beach on nice weather days. Additionally, with funding contributions from grants, we have purchased a new 6-seater ATV to support our Starfish Nipper program, major events, and various other lifesaving programs and operations. Finally, pending grant applications in the coming months, we plan to purchase a club vehicle to support our growing lifesaving operations at Quarantine and transport our growing fleet of lifesaving, education, and competition trailers and equipment.

I'd like to wish everyone a fantastic off-season, and a massive thank you to anyone who supported the equipment portfolio throughout the season. 



### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2024

The financial report is for Portsea Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Portsea Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a Club incorporated in Victoria and operating pursuant to the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012.

#### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Basis of Preparation**

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – AASB 1060: General Purpose Financial Statements Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities of the Australian Accounting Standards Board (AASB) and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012. The Club is a not-for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes under Australian Accounting Standards.

Australian Accounting Standards set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

### **Accounting Policies**

#### a. Revenue

#### Revenue Recognition

Operating Grants, Donations, Sponsorships and Bequests

When the Club receives operating grant revenue, donations, sponsorships or bequests, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance to AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers.

When both these conditions are satisfied, the Club:

- identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- · recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficient specific performance obligations, the Club:

- recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (for example AASB 9: Financial instruments, AASB 16: Leases, AASB 116: Property, plant and equipment and AASB 138: Intangible assets);
- recognises related amounts (being contributions by Members, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer, sponsor or funder);
   and
- recognises revenue immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount
  of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the Club recognises revenue in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

### Member Subscriptions

Member subscriptions are recognised as income in the year to which they relate. When subscriptions are received that relate to subsequent financial year, the amount received as deferred income is classified as liability.

#### Contributed Assets

The Club receives assets from the government and other parties at nil or nominal consideration in order to further its objectives. These assets are recognised in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards (for example AASB 9: Financial instruments, AASB 16: Leases, AASB 116: Property, plant and equipment).

On initial recognition of an asset, the Club recognises related amounts (being contributed by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer).

The Club recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between initial carrying amounts of the asset and the related amount.

### Income from sale of goods

The Club sells merchandising products, and food and beverages to Members. Revenue is recognised when control of the products has transferred to the customer. For such transactions, this is when the products are delivered to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

#### Interest Income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

#### b. Inventories

Inventories held for sale are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration, are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

### c. Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of property, plant and equipment is greater than the estimated recoverable amount, the carrying amount is written down immediately to the estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised in profit or loss. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present (refer to Note 1(e) for details of impairment).

Plant and equipment that have been contributed at no cost or for nominal cost are valued and recognised at the fair value of the asset at the date it is acquired.

### Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets including buildings and capitalised lease assets, but excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a diminishing value basis over the asset's useful life to the Club commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

### Class of Fixed Asset Average Depreciation Rate

Buildings 2.5% Fixture & Fittings 14% Plant and Equipment 33%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains or losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income in the period which they arise. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation surplus relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

#### d. Financial Instruments

Initial Recognition and measurement

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Club becomes a party to the contractual provisions to the instrument. For financial assets, this is the date that the Club commits itself to either the purchase or sale of the asset (i.e. trade date accounting is adopted).

Financial instruments (except for trade receivables) are initially measured at fair value plus transaction costs, except where the instrument is classified "at fair value through profit or loss", in which case transaction costs are expensed to profit or loss immediately. Where available, quoted prices in an active market are used to determine fair value. In other circumstances, valuation techniques are adopted.

Trade receivables are initially measured at the transaction price if the trade receivables do not contain a significant financing component or if the practical expedient was applied as specified in AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers.

Classification and subsequent measurement

Financial Liabilities

Financial liabilities are subsequently measured at:

- amortised cost; or
- fair value through profit or loss.

A financial liability is measured at fair value through profit or loss if the financial liability is:

- a contingent consideration of an acquirer in a business combination to which AASB 3: Business Combinations applies;
- held for trading; or
- initially designated as at fair value through profit or loss.

All other financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

The effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a debt instrument and of allocating interest expense in profit or loss over the relevant period.

The effective interest rate is the internal rate of return of the financial asset or liability. That is, it is the rate that exactly discounts the estimated future cash flows through the expected life of the instrument to the net carrying amount at initial recognition.

A financial liability is held for trading if it is:

- incurred for the purpose of repurchasing or repaying in the near term;
- part of a portfolio where there is an actual pattern of short-term profit taking; or
- a derivative financial instrument (except for a derivative that is in a financial guarantee contract or a
  derivative that is in an effective hedging relationship).

Any gains or losses arising on changes in fair value are recognised in profit or loss to the extent that they are not part of a designated hedging relationship.

The change in fair value of the financial liability attributable to changes in the issuer's credit risk is taken to other comprehensive income and is not subsequently reclassified to profit or loss. Instead, it is transferred to retained earnings upon derecognition of the financial liability.

If taking the change in credit risk in other comprehensive income enlarges or creates an accounting mismatch, then these gains or losses should be taken to profit or loss rather than other comprehensive income.

A financial liability cannot be reclassified.

### Financial assets

Financial assets are subsequently measured at:

- amortised cost;
- fair value through other comprehensive income; or

fair value through profit or loss.

Measurement is on the basis of two primary criteria:

- the contractual cash flow characteristics of the financial asset; and
- the business model for managing the financial assets.

A financial asset that meets the following conditions is subsequently measured at amortised cost:

- the financial asset is managed solely to collect contractual cash flows; and
- the contractual terms within the financial asset give rise to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding on specified dates.

A financial asset that meets the following conditions is subsequently measured at fair value through other comprehensive income:

- the contractual terms within the financial asset give rise to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding on specified dates; and
- the business model for managing the financial asset comprises both contractual cash flows collection and the selling of the financial asset.

By default, all other financial assets that do not meet the measurement conditions of amortised cost and fair value through other comprehensive income are subsequently measured at fair value through profit or loss.

The Club initially designates a financial instrument as measured at fair value through profit or loss if:

- it eliminates or significantly reduces a measurement or recognition inconsistency (often referred to as an "accounting mismatch") that would otherwise arise from measuring assets or liabilities or recognising the gains and losses on them on different bases;
- it is in accordance with the documented risk management or investment strategy and information about
  the grouping is documented appropriately, so the performance of the financial liability that is part of a
  group of financial liabilities or financial assets can be managed and evaluated consistently on a fair
  value basis; and
- it is a hybrid contract that contains an embedded derivative that significantly modifies the cash flows otherwise required by the contract.

The initial designation of the financial instruments to measure at fair value through profit or loss is a one-time option on initial classification and is irrevocable until the financial asset is derecognised.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2024

#### Derecognition

Derecognition refers to the removal of a previously recognised financial asset or financial liability from the statement of financial position.

Derecognition of financial liabilities

A liability is derecognised when it is extinguished (i.e. when the obligation in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires). An exchange of an existing financial liability for a new one with substantially modified terms, or a substantial modification to the terms of a financial liability, is treated as an extinguishment of the existing liability and recognition of a new financial liability.

The difference between the carrying amount of the financial liability derecognised and the consideration paid and payable, including any non-cash assets transferred or liabilities assumed, is recognised in profit or loss.

Derecognition of financial assets

A financial asset is derecognised when the holder's contractual rights to its cash flows expires, or the asset is transferred in such a way that all the risks and rewards of ownership are substantially transferred.

All the following criteria need to be satisfied for the derecognition of a financial asset:

- the right to receive cash flows from the asset has expired or been transferred;
- all risk and rewards of ownership of the asset have been substantially transferred; and
- the Club no longer controls the asset (i.e. it has no practical ability to make unilateral decisions to sell the asset to a third party).

On derecognition of a financial asset measured at amortised cost, the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the sum of the consideration received and receivable is recognised in profit or loss.

On derecognition of a debt instrument classified as fair value through other comprehensive income, the cumulative gain or loss previously accumulated in the investment revaluation reserve is reclassified to profit or loss.

On derecognition of an investment in equity which the Club elected to classify under fair value through other comprehensive income, the cumulative gain or loss previously accumulated in the investments revaluation reserve is not reclassified to profit or loss, but is transferred to retained earnings.

#### Impairment

The Club recognises a loss allowance for expected credit losses on:

- financial assets that are measured at amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income;
- lease receivables;
- contract assets (e.g. amount due from customers under construction contracts);
- loan commitments that are not measured at fair value through profit or loss; and
- financial guarantee contracts that are not measured at fair value through profit or loss.

Loss allowance is not recognised for:

- financial assets measured at fair value through profit or loss; or
- equity instruments measured at fair value through other comprehensive income.

Expected credit losses are the probability-weighted estimate of credit losses over the expected life of a financial instrument. A credit loss is the difference between all contractual cash flows that are due and all cash flows expected to be received, all discounted at the original effective interest rate of the financial instrument.

The Club uses the following approaches to impairment, as applicable under AASB 9: Financial Instruments:

the simplified approach;

Simplified approach

The simplified approach does not require tracking of changes in credit risk at every reporting period, but instead requires the recognition of lifetime expected credit loss at all times.

This approach is applicable to:

- trade receivables or contract assets that result from transactions that are within the scope of AASB 15:
   Revenue from Contracts with Customers, and which do not contain a significant financing component;
   and
- lease receivables.

In measuring the expected credit loss, a provision matrix for trade receivables is used taking into consideration various data to get to an expected credit loss (i.e. diversity of its customer base, appropriate groupings of its historical loss experience, etc).

For the year ended 30 April 2023 the Committee estimate the loss rate to be zero, therefore no expected credit loss allowance was recognised.

### e. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Club reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is recognised in profit or loss.

Where the assets are not held primarily for their ability to generate cash inflows – that is, they are specialised assets held for continuing use of their service capacity – the recoverable amounts are expected to be materially the same as fair value.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an assets class, the Club estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the class of assets belong.

Where an impairment loss on a revalued individual asset is identified, this is recognised against the revaluation surplus in respect of the same class of asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same class of asset.

#### f. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks.

#### g. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities, which are recoverable from or payable to the ATO, are presented as operating cash flows included in receipts from customers or payments to suppliers.

#### h. Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the Club a Public Benevolent Institution and is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

### i. Employee Benefits

#### Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Club's obligation for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries, annual leave and sick leave. Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

The Club's obligations for short-term employee benefits such as wages and salaries are recognised as part of trade and other payables in the statement of financial position. Contributions are made by the Club to an employee's superannuation fund and are charged as expenditure when incurred.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2024

#### i. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from sponsors, outstanding grant receipts and other miscellaneous debtors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

Trade receivables are initially recognised at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any provision for impairment. Refer to Note 1 (d) for further discussion on the determination of impairment losses.

### k. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the Club that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amount normally paid within 30 days of the recognition of the liability. Trade and other payables are initially measured at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

### I. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the Club has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions recognised represent the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

### m. Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

### n. Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The Committee evaluate estimates and judgments incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Club.

#### **Key Estimates & Judgements**

### (i) Impairment

The Club assesses impairment at each reporting date by evaluation of conditions and events specific to the Club that may be indicative of impairment triggers.

### (ii) Useful lives of property, plant and equipment

As described in Note 1(c), the Club reviews the estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment at the end of each annual reporting period.

### (iii) Property Lease

The Club only has a lease of clubhouse land which is considered a peppercorn lease (lease significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the Club to further its objectives) and the Club has not elected to measure this lease at fair value, the lease cost is considered a low-value lease and as such the Club has elected to apply the 'low-value' exemption in accordance with AASB 16: Leases.

### (iv) Performance obligations under AASB 15: Revenue from Contracts with Customers

To identify a performance obligation under AASB 15, the promise must be sufficiently specific to be able to determine when the obligation is satisfied. The Committee exercises judgement to determine whether the promise is sufficiently specific by taking into account any conditions specified in the arrangement, explicit or implicit, regarding the promised goods or services. In making this assessment, Committee includes the nature/type, cost/value, quantity, and the period of transfer related to the goods or services promised.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2024

### (v) Employee benefits

For the purpose of measurement, AASB 119: Employee Benefits defines obligations for short-term employee benefits as obligations expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service. The Committee believe that obligations for part of annual leave entitlements satisfy the definition of short-term employee benefits and are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

### o. New and Amended Accounting Standards Adopted by the Club

Initial adoption of AASB 1060: General Purpose Financial Statements – Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities

The Club has adopted AASB 1060: General Purpose Financial Statements – Simplified Disclosures for For-Profit and Not-for-Profit Tier 2 Entities for the first time this reporting period. The standard, which sets out a new separate disclosure Standard to be applied by all entities that are reporting under Tier 2 of the Differential Reporting Framework in AASB 1053: Application of Tiers of Australian Accounting, replaces the previous Reduced Disclosure Requirements (RDR) framework. The application of this standard has resulted in reductions in disclosures compared to RDR in Revenue, Leases and Financial Instruments; however has resulted in new and/or increased disclosures in areas such as Audit Fees and Related Parties.

The adoption of this standard did not have a material impact on the financial statements, hence comparative balances were not restated.

### p. New Accounting Standards and Amendments Not Yet Adopted by the Club

New standards and amendments are not expected to have a material impact on the financial statements of the Club.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2024

#### q. Going Concern

The Club made a surplus of \$65,745 during the year ended 30 April 2024 (for the year ended 30 April 2023: \$180,196), a net cash inflow from operating activities of \$471,904 (for the year ended 30 April 2023: \$400,782), and, as of that date, the Club's current assets exceeded its current liabilities by \$2,781,442 (as at 30 April 2023: \$2,550,663). In addition to generating sufficient cash flows and surpluses, the Club's ability to continue as a going concern and to meet its debts and commitments as they fall due are dependent on:

- The renewal of the crown land lease under which the clubhouse is built on
- The ongoing support of the Club's members

The crown land lease under which the clubhouse is built on expired on 31 December 2019 and remains in an overholding period ever since. The renewal of this lease is pivotal to the Club's ongoing operations and overall survivability. Administrative delays have hindered the timely renewal of the lease. Nevertheless, the Committee is in constant communication with the relevant government agency and expects the lease to be renewed in a similar form.

The Club is a membership based organisation and is reliant on the support of its members to generate sufficient cash flows and surpluses. Membership income remained steady over the past few years and based on the budget, the Committee expects membership income to grow over the coming years.

The Club's surplus and cash inflows from operating activities decreased in the current year primarily due to increased salaries and wages, cost of food and beverages and event costs. Nonetheless, based on the budget, the Committee expects the Club to continue to generate positive operating cash flows and surpluses for the foreseeable future.

Based on the above, The Committee believes that the Club will be able to discharge its debts and liabilities as and when they fall due. Therefore, the Club's financial statements have prepared on a going concern basis.

Should the Club be unable to continue as a going concern, it may be required to realise its assets and extinguish its liabilities other than in the normal course of business and at amounts different to those stated in the financial statements. The financial statements do not include any adjustments relating to the recoverability and classification of asset carrying amounts, or to the amount and classification of liabilities that might result should the Club be unable to continue as a going concern and meet its debts as and when they fall due.
